5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Title 4, Business & Commerce Code, is amended by
7	adding Chapter 46 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 46. SEXUALLY ORIENTED BUSINESSES
9	Sec. 46.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Sex offender" means a person who has been
11	convicted of or placed on deferred adjudication for an offense:
12	(A) for which a person is subject to registration
13	under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure; or
14	(B) under Chapter 21 or 43, Penal Code, or
15	Section 71.02(a)(3), Penal Code, regardless of whether the offense
16	is an offense for which a person is subject to registration under
17	Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure.
18	(2) "Sexually oriented business" has the meaning
19	assigned by Section 243.002, Local Government Code.
20	Sec. 46.002. PROHIBITION ON OWNERSHIP, OPERATION, OR
21	MANAGEMENT BY OR EMPLOYMENT OF SEX OFFENDER. (a) A sex offender may
22	not own wholly or partly or serve as a director, officer, operator,
23	manager, or employee of a sexually oriented business.
24	(b) A sexually oriented business may not contract with a

1	person to operate or manage the business as an independent
2	contractor or employ a person as an officer, operator, manager, or
3	other employee if the business knows the person is a sex offender.
4	Sec. 46.003. INJUNCTION. (a) The attorney general or the
5	appropriate district or county attorney, in the name of the state,
6	may bring an action for an injunction or other process against a
7	person who is violating or threatening to violate Section 46.002.
8	The action may be brought in a district court of Travis County or of
9	a county in which any part of the violation or threatened violation
10	occurs.
11	(b) The district court may grant any prohibitory or
12	mandatory relief warranted by the facts, including a temporary
13	restraining order, temporary injunction, or permanent injunction.
14	Sec. 46.004. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A sex offender commits
15	an offense if the offender violates Section 46.002(a).
16	(b) A sexually oriented business commits an offense if the
17	business violates Section 46.002(b).
18	(c) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
