A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the punishment for criminal mischief committed by 3 intentionally introducing infectious diseases into livestock.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 28.03, Penal Code, is amended by adding 6 Subsection (i) to read as follows:

7 (i) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), an offense under this 8 section is a felony of the first degree if the property is livestock 9 and the damage is caused by introducing bovine spongiform 10 encephalopathy, commonly known as mad cow disease, or a disease 11 described by Section 161.041(a), Agriculture Code. In this 12 subsection, "livestock" has the meaning assigned by Section 13 161.001, Agriculture Code.

SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs before the effective date.

(b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
