## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to excused absences for religious holy days for students
- 3 in institutions of higher education.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 51.911(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (b) An institution of higher education shall <u>excuse a</u>
- 8 student from attending [allow a student who is absent from] classes
- 9 or other required activities, including examinations, for the
- 10 observance of a religious holy day, including travel for that
- 11 purpose. A student whose absence is excused under this subsection
- 12 <u>may not be penalized for that absence and shall be allowed</u> to take
- an examination or complete an assignment <u>from which the student is</u>
- 14 excused [scheduled for that day] within a reasonable time after the
- 15 absence [if, not later than the 15th day after the first day of the
- 16 semester, the student notified the instructor of each class the
- 17 student had scheduled on that date that the student would be absent
- 18 for a religious holy day].
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 51.911(c), Education Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 3. (a) Sections 1 and 2 of this Act apply beginning
- 21 with the 2003 fall semester.
- (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 23 adopt rules for the administration of Section 51.911(b), Education
- 24 Code, as amended by this Act, or amend its existing rules for that

- 1 purpose as soon as practicable after this Act takes effect. Before
- October 1, 2003, the coordinating board may adopt or amend the rules
- 3 in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
