5	SECTION 1. Section 51.911(b), Education Code, is amended to

7	(b) An institution of higher education shall <u>excuse a</u>
8	student from attending [allow a student who is absent from] classes
9	or other required activities, including examinations, for the
10	observance of a religious holy day, including travel for that
11	purpose. A student whose absence is excused under this subsection
12	may not be penalized for that absence and shall be allowed to take
13	an examination or complete an assignment from which the student is
14	<u>excused</u> [scheduled for that day] within a reasonable time after the
15	absence [if, not later than the 15th day after the first day of the
16	semester, the student notified the instructor of each class the
17	student had scheduled on that date that the student would be absent
18	for a religious holy day].
19	SECTION 2. Section 51.911(c), Education Code, is repealed.
20	SECTION 3. (a) Sections 1 and 2 of this Act apply beginning
21	with the 2003 fall semester.
22	(b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
23	adopt rules for the administration of Section 51.911(b), Education

Code, as amended by this Act, or amend its existing rules for that

purpose as soon as practicable after this Act takes effect. Before
October 1, 2003, the coordinating board may adopt or amend the rules
in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.

4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
