9	governing board of an institution of higher education may make a
10	contribution to the optional retirement program as provided by this
11	section. The governing board may use any source of funds for the
12	contribution.
13	(b) A contribution under this section may be any amount that
14	is equal to or less than the difference between the amount the state
15	is required to contribute under Section 830.201 to the benefit of
16	each participant employed by the institution of higher education
17	and the amount the state appropriates for that purpose.
18	(c) The governing board of an institution of higher
19	education may contribute an amount under this section to the
20	benefit of a participant employed by an institution of higher
21	education on or before August 31, 1995, that is different from the
22	amount the governing board contributes to the benefit of a
23	participant employed by an institution of higher education after
24	that date.

1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
