- 2 relating to forensic evidence training for students enrolled in 3 certain medical or nursing degree programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 51, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 51.310 to read as follows:
- Sec. 51.310. FORENSIC EVIDENCE COLLECTION COURSE 7 REQUIREMENT. (a) An institution of higher education, as defined by 8 9 Section 61.003, that offers a program leading to a doctor of medicine or doctor of osteopathy degree or to a degree that 10 11 satisfies the educational requirement for licensure as a registered 12 nurse shall establish a course in forensic evidence collection and, except as provided by Subsection (b), require completion of the 13 14 course as a prerequisite to receiving the degree.
- 15 (b) The institution of higher education may determine
  16 whether to award to a student enrolled in the degree program credit
  17 for a substantially similar course successfully completed at
  18 another public or accredited private institution of higher
  19 education.
- 20 <u>(c) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall</u>
  21 <u>establish standards for the course required by this section.</u>
- SECTION 2. (a) Each institution of higher education offering a degree program to which Section 51.310, Education Code, as added by this Act, applies must offer the course required by that

- 1 section not later than the fall 2004 semester.
- 2 (b) Section 51.310, Education Code, as added by this Act,
- 3 applies only to a student who initially enrolls in a degree program
- 4 to which that section applies on or after August 1, 2004.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
