14	SECTION 2. Sections 545.413(a) and (b), Transportation
15	Code, are amended to read as follows:
16	(a) A person commits an offense if the person:
17	(1) is at least 15 years of age;
18	(2) is riding in [the front seat of] a passenger
19	vehicle while the vehicle is being operated;
20	(3) is occupying a seat that is equipped with a safety
21	belt; and
22	(4) is not secured by a safety belt.
23	(b) A person commits an offense if the person:
24	(1) operates a passenger vehicle that is equipped with

1 safety belts; and

(2) allows a child who is at least <u>four</u> [five] years of
age but younger than 17 years of age [or who is younger than five
years of age] and <u>who is</u> at least 36 inches in height to ride in the
vehicle without requiring the child to be secured by a safety belt,
provided the child is occupying a seat that is equipped with a
safety belt.

8 SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies 9 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this 10 Act. For the purposes of this section, an offense is committed 11 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense 12 occurs before that date.

(b) An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
