## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the regulation of licensed vocational nurses.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 302, Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 302.0001 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 302.0001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as
- 7 <u>the Licensed Vocational Nursing Practice Act.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 302.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 302.003. APPLICATION OF CHAPTER. (a) This chapter
- 11 does not apply to:
- 12 (1) <u>gratuitous</u> nursing <u>care</u> of the sick <u>that is</u>
- 13 provided [without charge] by a friend;
- 14 (2) nursing care provided by a registered nurse
- 15 licensed under Chapter 301;
- 16 (3) nursing care provided during a disaster under the
- 17 state emergency management plan adopted under Section 418.042,
- 18 Government Code, if the person providing the care does not
- 19 represent that the person is a licensed vocational nurse, unless
- 20 the person is licensed in another state;
- 21 (4) nursing care in which treatment is provided solely
- 22 by prayer or spiritual means;
- 23 (5) an unlicensed person acting under the delegated
- 24 authority of:

1	(A) a physician licensed by the Texas State Board
2	of Medical Examiners; or
3	(B) a registered nurse licensed under Chapter 301
4	or authorized to practice in this state under Chapter 304, as added
5	by Section 14.130(a), Chapter 1420, Acts of the 77th Legislature,
6	Regular Session, 2001;
7	(6) an act performed by a person licensed by another
8	state agency if the act is authorized by the statute under which the
9	person is licensed;
10	(7) the practice of nursing that is incidental to a
11	program of study by a student enrolled in a board-accredited
12	vocational nurse education program leading to an initial license as
13	a licensed vocational nurse; or
14	(8) the practice of nursing by a licensed vocational
15	nurse or licensed practical nurse licensed in another state who is
16	in this state on a nonroutine basis for a period not to exceed 120
17	hours to provide:
18	(A) care to a patient being transported into, out
19	of, or through this state; or
20	(B) vocational nursing.
21	(b) This chapter does not authorize the practice of medicine
22	as defined by Chapter 151. [or family member; or
23	[ <del>(2)</del> a person who does not:
24	[(A) represent to the public that the person is a
25	licensed vocational nurse; or
26	[ <del>(B) use the abbreviation "L.V.N."</del> ]
27	SECTION 3. Section 302.056(b), Occupations Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (b) A board member may [not] receive reimbursement for
- 3 travel expenses [, including expenses for meals and lodging, other
- 4 than transportation expenses. A member is entitled to
- 5 reimbursement for transportation expenses as provided by the
- 6 General Appropriations Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 302.151(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (b) The board may adopt <u>and enforce</u> rules <u>consistent with</u>
- 10 <u>this chapter and [as]</u> necessary to:
- 11 (1) perform [govern] its duties and conduct
- 12 proceedings before the board;
- 13 (2) regulate the practice of vocational nursing;
- 14 (3) establish standards of professional conduct for
- 15 license holders under this chapter; and
- 16 (4) determine whether an act constitutes the practice
- 17 of vocational nursing [and to implement the purposes of this
- 18 chapter].
- 19 SECTION 5. Subchapter D, Chapter 302, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 302.159 to read as follows:
- Sec. 302.159. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The Practice
- 22 Advisory Committee shall advise the board regarding rules related
- 23 to the scope of the practice of vocational nursing.
- 24 (b) The advisory committee is appointed by the board and
- consists of the following members:
- 26 (1) a member of the board;
- 27 (2) a member of the Board of Nurse Examiners;

1	(3) a licensed vocational nurse recommended by the
2	Licensed Vocational Nurses Association of Texas;
3	(4) a licensed vocational nurse recommended by the
4	Texas League for Vocational Nurses;
5	(5) a registered nurse recommended by the Texas
6	Organization of Nurse Executives;
7	(6) a registered nurse recommended by the Texas Nurses
8	Association;
9	(7) a person recommended by the Texas Association of
10	Vocational Nurse Educators;
11	(8) a person recommended by the Texas Organization for
12	the Advancement of Associate Degree Nursing;
13	(9) a person recommended by the Texas Organization of
14	Baccalaureate and Graduate Nursing Educators;
15	(10) a person recommended by the Texas Hospital
16	Association;
17	(11) a person recommended by the Texas Health Care
18	Association or the Texas Association of Homes and Services for the
19	Aging;
20	(12) a person recommended by the Texas Association for
21	<pre>Home Care;</pre>
22	(13) a person recommended by the Texas Department of
23	Mental Health and Mental Retardation; and
24	(14) a person recommended by the Texas Association of
25	School Nurses.
26	(c) The member of the advisory committee appointed under
27	Subdivision (b)(1) serves as the presiding officer of the

- 2 (d) Members of the advisory committee other than the members
- 3 appointed under Subdivisions (b)(1), (2), and (13) are not entitled
- 4 to reimbursement for expenses.
- 5 SECTION 6. Subchapter E, Chapter 302, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 302.207 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 302.207. MANDATORY REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. (a) A
- 8 hospital, nursing home, or other employer of a licensed vocational
- 9 nurse shall report to the board the name of each licensed vocational
- 10 nurse whose employment is terminated, or who resigns to avoid
- 11 termination, for engaging in any conduct specified by Section
- 12 302.401 or 302.402.
- 13 (b) A person is not liable in a civil action for a failure to
- 14 report as required by Subsection (a).
- 15 <u>(c) The appropriate state licensing agency may take action</u>
- against a person regulated by the agency for a failure to report as
- 17 required by Subsection (a).
- SECTION 7. Section 302.255(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 (a) The director of education or the director of education's
- 21 <u>designee</u> shall visit and survey each vocational nursing institution
- 22 to determine whether the board's minimum requirements for
- vocational nurse education programs are being met.
- SECTION 8. Section 302.256(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- 26 (a) The director of education or the director of education's
- 27 designee [board] periodically shall survey each vocational nurse

- 1 education program offered in this state. A written report of the
- 2 survey must be submitted to the board.
- 3 SECTION 9. Section 302.301(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (a) A person may not practice vocational nursing or use the
- 6 designation "Licensed Vocational Nurse" or the abbreviation
- 7 "L.V.N." unless the person holds a license under this chapter.
- 8 SECTION 10. Section 302.307(b), Occupations Code, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) A temporary permit expires on the date:
- 11 (1) the applicant receives a permanent license from
- 12 the board; or
- 13 (2) the board notifies the applicant that the
- 14 applicant has failed the examination [a failing examination result
- 15 for the applicant is reported to the board].
- SECTION 11. Sections 302.403 and 302.409, Occupations Code,
- 17 are amended to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 302.403. DISCIPLINARY AUTHORITY OF BOARD; METHODS OF
- 19 DISCIPLINE. After a hearing is held on specific sworn written
- 20 charges [filed by the secretary-treasurer], if the board determines
- 21 that a person has committed an act listed in Section 302.402, the
- 22 board may:
- 23 (1) refuse to admit the person to a board examination;
- 24 (2) deny the person's application for a license,
- 25 license renewal, or temporary permit;
- 26 (3) issue a warning or reprimand;
- 27 (4) suspend or revoke the person's license as a

- 1 vocational nurse; or
- 2 (5) place on probation a person whose license has been
- 3 suspended.
- 4 Sec. 302.409. APPEAL. A person may appeal a board order
- 5 disciplining the person [in a district court of the county of the
- 6 person's residence].
- 7 SECTION 12. Subchapter I, Chapter 302, Occupations Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 302.412 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 302.412. CONFIDENTIALITY. (a) A complaint and
- 10 investigation concerning a licensed vocational nurse under this
- 11 subchapter, and all information and material compiled by the board
- in connection with the complaint and investigation, are:
- 13 (1) confidential and not subject to disclosure under
- 14 Chapter 552, Government Code; and
- 15 (2) not subject to disclosure, discovery, subpoena, or
- other means of legal compulsion for release to anyone other than the
- 17 board or a board employee or agent involved in license holder
- 18 discipline.
- 19 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), information regarding a
- 20 complaint and an investigation of a licensed vocational nurse may
- 21 be disclosed to:
- 22 (1) a person involved with the board in a disciplinary
- 23 <u>action against the licensed vocational nurse;</u>
- 24 (2) a vocational nursing licensing or disciplinary
- 25 board in another jurisdiction;
- 26 (3) a peer assistance program approved by the board
- 27 under Chapter 467, Health and Safety Code;

1	(4) a law enforcement agency; or
2	(5) a person engaged in bona fide research, if all
3	information identifying a specific individual has been deleted.
4	(c) The filing of formal charges against a licensed
5	vocational nurse by the board, the nature of those charges,
6	disciplinary proceedings of the board, and final disciplinary
7	actions, including warnings and reprimands, by the board are not
8	confidential and are subject to disclosure in accordance with
9	Chapter 552, Government Code.
10	SECTION 13. Section 302.501, Occupations Code, is amended
11	to read as follows:
12	Sec. 302.501. INJUNCTIONS. $\underline{(a)}$ On petition of the board, a
13	district court may enjoin a person who is violating this chapter
14	from continuing the violation.
15	(b) A petition under this section may be filed in a district
16	<pre>court in:</pre>
17	(1) Travis County;
18	(2) the county in which the defendant resides; or
19	(3) the county in which the violation is occurring.
20	SECTION 14. Chapter 302, Occupations Code, is amended by
21	adding Subchapter L to read as follows:
22	SUBCHAPTER L. PRACTICE BY LICENSE HOLDER
23	Sec. 302.551. SUPERVISION AND DELEGATION. (a) In this
24	section, "delegate" means to grant a person the legal authority to
25	perform an act the person is not otherwise legally authorized to
26	<pre>perform.</pre>
27	(b) A licensed vocational nurse may only practice under the

- 1 supervision of a registered nurse, physician, dentist, podiatrist,
- 2 or other health care provider authorized to order the
- 3 administration of medications and treatments.
- (c) A licensed vocational nurse may not delegate a health
- 5 care task, activity, or function to another person.
- 6 Sec. 302.552. PROTECTION FOR REFUSAL TO ENGAGE IN CERTAIN
- 7 CONDUCT. (a) A person may not suspend, terminate, or otherwise
- 8 discipline or discriminate against a licensed vocational nurse who
- 9 refuses to engage in an act or omission relating to patient care
- 10 that would constitute a ground for disciplinary action under
- 11 <u>Section 302.403</u> if the licensed vocational nurse notifies the
- 12 person at the time of the refusal that the reason for refusing is
- 13 that the act or omission:
- 14 (1) constitutes a ground for disciplinary action by
- the board; or
- 16 (2) is a violation of this chapter or a rule of the
- 17 board.
- 18 (b) An act by a person under Subsection (a) does not
- 19 constitute a violation of this section if a nursing peer review
- 20 committee under Chapter 303 determines:
- 21 (1) that the act or omission the licensed vocational
- 22 nurse refused to engage in was not a ground for disciplinary action
- 23 under Section 302.403; or
- 24 (2) that:
- 25 (A) the act or omission the licensed vocational
- 26 nurse refused to engage in was a ground for disciplinary action
- 27 under Section 302.403; and

1	(B) the person:
2	(i) rescinds any disciplinary or
3	discriminatory action taken against the licensed vocational nurse;
4	(ii) compensates the licensed vocational
5	nurse for lost wages; and
6	(iii) restores to the licensed vocational
7	nurse any lost benefits.
8	(c) A licensed vocational nurse's rights under this section
9	may not be nullified by a contract.
10	(d) An appropriate licensing agency may take action against
11	a person who violates this section.
12	Sec. 302.553. IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY FOR PROVIDING OR
13	RELYING ON INFORMATION. (a) A person may not be subject to
14	liability for damages in a civil action if the person, in good
15	faith, provides to the board information relating to:
16	(1) an alleged incident of negligence or malpractice
17	on the part of a holder of or an applicant for a license under this
18	<pre>chapter; or</pre>
19	(2) the qualifications, fitness, or character of a
20	holder of or an applicant for a license under this chapter.
21	(b) The board and the staff of the board may not be subject
22	to liability for damages in a civil action for taking action in
23	reliance on information provided under Subsection (a).
24	Sec. 302.554. PROTECTION FOR REPORTING CERTAIN
25	INFORMATION. A person may not suspend, terminate, or otherwise
26	discipline or discriminate against a person who, in good faith,
27	provides information to the board as provided by Section

- 1 <u>302.553(a).</u>
- 2 SECTION 15. Section 303.002(b), Occupations Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (b) The board shall enter into a memorandum of understanding
- 5 with each state agency that licenses, registers, or certifies a
- 6 facility required by law to have a <u>nursing</u> [registered nurse] peer
- 7 review committee. The memorandum of understanding must:
- 8 (1) state the actions the board and agency are to take
- 9 to encourage compliance with the requirement to have a nursing
- 10 [registered nurse] peer review committee; and
- 11 (2) be adopted as a rule of the board and the agency.
- SECTION 16. Sections 303.005(a)-(d) and (f), Occupations
- 13 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) In this section, "duty to a patient" means conduct
- 15 required by standards of practice or professional conduct adopted
- 16 by the board. The term includes administrative decisions directly
- 17 affecting a [registered] nurse's ability to comply with that duty.
- 18 (b) If a person who regularly employs, hires, or otherwise
- 19 contracts for the services of at least 10 [registered] nurses
- 20 requests one of those nurses to engage in conduct that the nurse
- 21 believes violates a [registered] nurse's duty to a patient, the
- 22 nurse may request, on a form produced by the board, a determination
- 23 by a nursing peer review committee under this chapter of whether the
- 24 conduct violates a [registered] nurse's duty to a patient.
- 25 (c) A [<del>registered</del>] nurse who in good faith requests a peer
- 26 review determination under Subsection (b):
- 27 (1) may not be disciplined or discriminated against

- for making the request;
- 2 (2) may engage in the requested conduct pending the
- 3 peer review;
- 4 (3) is not subject to the reporting requirement under
- 5 Subchapter I, Chapter 301; and
- 6 (4) may not be disciplined by the board for engaging in
- 7 that conduct while the peer review is pending.
- 8 (d) The determinations of the peer review committee shall be
- 9 considered in a decision to discipline the nurse, but the
- 10 determinations are not binding if a [registered] nurse
- 11 administrator believes in good faith that the peer review committee
- 12 has incorrectly determined a [registered] nurse's duty.
- (f) A [registered] nurse's rights under this section may not
- 14 be nullified by a contract.
- SECTION 17. Section 531.051(f), Government Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (f) Sections [Section] 301.251(a) and 302.301(a),
- 18 Occupations Code,  $\underline{do}$  [ $\underline{does}$ ] not apply to delivery of a service for
- 19 which payment is provided under the voucher payment program
- 20 developed under this section if:
- 21 (1) the person who delivers the service:
- 22 (A) has not been denied a license under Chapter
- 301 or 302, Occupations Code;
- 24 (B) has not been issued a license under Chapter
- 301 or 302, Occupations Code, that is revoked or suspended; and
- 26 (C) provides a service listed under Subsection
- 27 (h); and

- 1 (2) the consumer who receives the service:
- 2 (A) has a functional disability and the service
- 3 would have been performed by the consumer, or the parent or quardian
- 4 for the consumer, except for that disability; and
- 5 (B) if:
- 6 (i) the consumer is capable of training the
- 7 person in the proper performance of the service, the consumer
- 8 directs the person to deliver the service; or
- 9 (ii) the consumer is not capable of
- 10 training the person in the proper performance of the service, the
- 11 consumer's parent or guardian is capable of training the person in
- 12 the proper performance of the service and directs the person to
- 13 deliver the service.
- SECTION 18. Sections 302.057(c) and (d), Occupations Code,
- 15 are repealed.
- SECTION 19. (a) This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 17 (b) As soon as practicable on or after the effective date of
- this Act, the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners shall appoint the
- 19 members of the Practice Advisory Committee established under
- 20 Section 302.159, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
