## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 1 2 relating to the regulation of licensed vocational nurses. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 302, Occupations Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Section 302.0001 to read as follows: Sec. 302.0001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as 6 the Licensed Vocational Nursing Practice Act. 7 SECTION 2. Section 302.003, Occupations Code, is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 Sec. 302.003. APPLICATION OF CHAPTER. 10 (a) This chapter 11 does not apply to: 12 (1) gratuitous nursing care of the sick that is provided [without charge] by a friend; 13 14 (2) nursing care provided by a registered nurse licensed under Chapter 301; 15 (3) nursing care provided during a disaster under the 16 state emergency management plan adopted under Section 418.042, 17 18 Government Code, if the person providing the care does not represent that the person is a licensed vocational nurse, unless 19 the person is licensed in another state; 20 21 (4) nursing care in which treatment is provided solely by prayer or spiritual means; 22 23 (5) an act performed by a person under the control or supervision or at the instruction of a person licensed by the Texas 24

2	(6) an act performed by a person licensed by another
3	state agency if the act is authorized by the statute under which the

5	(7) the practice of nursing that is incidental to a
6	program of study by a student enrolled in a board-accredited

8	a licensed vocational nurse; or
9	(8) the practice of nursing by a licensed vocational
10	nurse or licensed practical nurse licensed in another state who is
11	in this state on a nonroutine basis for a period not to exceed 120
12	hours to:
13	(A) provide care to a patient being transported
14	into, out of, or through this state;
15	(B) provide vocational nursing consulting
16	services; or
17	(C) attend or present a continuing nursing
18	education program.
19	(b) This chapter does not authorize the practice of medicine
20	as defined by Chapter 151. [ <del>or family member; or</del>
21	[ <del>(2) a person who does not:</del>
22	[ <del>(A) represent to the public that the person is a</del>
23	licensed vocational nurse; or
24	[ <del>(B) use the abbreviation "L.V.N."</del> ]
25	SECTION 3. Section 302.056(b), Occupations Code, is amended
26	to read as follows:
27	(b) A board member may [ <del>not</del> ] receive reimbursement for

travel expenses[, including expenses for meals and lodging, other 1 than transportation expenses. A member is entitled to 2 reimbursement for transportation expenses] as provided by the 3 4 General Appropriations Act. SECTION 4. Section 302.151(b), Occupations Code, is amended 5 6 to read as follows: 7 (b) The board may adopt and enforce rules consistent with 8 this chapter and [as] necessary to: duties and [<del>govern</del>] 9 (1) perform its conduct proceedings before the board; 10 (2) regulate the practice of vocational nursing; 11 (3) establish standards of professional conduct for 12 license holders under this chapter; and 13 14 (4) determine whether an act constitutes the practice 15 of vocational nursing [and to implement the purposes of this chapter]. 16 SECTION 5. Section 302.255(a), Occupations Code, is amended 17 to read as follows: 18 The director of education or the director of education's 19 (a) designee shall visit and survey each vocational nursing institution 20 to determine whether the board's minimum requirements for 21 vocational nurse education programs are being met. 22 SECTION 6. Section 302.256(a), Occupations Code, is amended 23 24 to read as follows: 25 The director of education or the director of education's (a) designee [board] periodically shall survey each vocational nurse 26 education program offered in this state. A written report of the 27

survey must be submitted to the board. SECTION 7. Section 302.301(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: (a) A person may not practice vocational nursing or use the designation "Licensed Vocational Nurse" or the abbreviation "L.V.N." unless the person holds a license under this chapter. SECTION 8. Section 302.307(b), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: A temporary permit expires on the date: (b) (1) the applicant receives a permanent license from the board; or the board notifies the applicant that the (2) applicant has failed the examination [a failing examination result for the applicant is reported to the board]. SECTION 9. Subchapter G, Chapter 302, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 302.312 to read as follows: Sec. 302.312. PROTECTION FOR REFUSAL TO ENGAGE IN CERTAIN CONDUCT. (a) A person may not suspend, terminate, or otherwise discipline or discriminate against a licensed vocational nurse who refuses to engage in an act or omission relating to patient care that would constitute a ground for disciplinary action under Section 302.403 if the licensed vocational nurse notifies the person at the time of the refusal that the reason for refusing is that the act or omission: (1) constitutes a ground for disciplinary action by the board; or (2) is a violation of this chapter or a rule of the

2	(b) An act by a person under Subsection (a) does not
3	constitute a violation of this section if a nursing peer review
4	committee under Chapter 303 determines:
5	(1) that the act or omission the licensed vocational
6	nurse refused to engage in was not a ground for disciplinary action
7	under Section 302.403; or
8	(2) that:
9	(A) the act or omission the licensed vocational
10	nurse refused to engage in was a ground for disciplinary action
11	under Section 302.403; and
12	(B) the person:
13	(i) rescinds any disciplinary or
14	discriminatory action taken against the licensed vocational nurse;
15	(ii) compensates the licensed vocational
16	nurse for lost wages; and
17	(iii) restores to the licensed vocational
18	nurse any lost benefits.
19	(c) A licensed vocational nurse's rights under this section
20	may not be nullified by a contract.
21	(d) An appropriate licensing agency may take action against
22	a person who violates this section.
23	SECTION 10. Sections 302.057(c) and (d), Occupations Code,
24	are repealed.
25	SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
