Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 21.0491 to read as follows: 1-16 Sec. 21.0491. TEMPORARY CERTIFICATION OF PERSONS HOLDING CERTAIN DEGREES. If this 2-12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-13 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
