- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 4.001(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (b) The objectives of public education are:
- OBJECTIVE 1: Parents will be full partners with educators
- 8 in the education of their children.
- 9 OBJECTIVE 2: Students will be encouraged and challenged to
- 10 meet their full educational potential.
- OBJECTIVE 3: Through enhanced dropout prevention efforts,
- 12 all students will remain in school until they obtain a high school
- 13 diploma.
- OBJECTIVE 4: A well-balanced and appropriate curriculum
- 15 will be provided to all students.
- OBJECTIVE 5: Educators will prepare students to be
- thoughtful, active citizens who have an appreciation for the basic
- 18 values of our state and national heritage and who can understand and
- 19 productively function in a free enterprise society.
- OBJECTIVE $\underline{6}$ [$\underline{5}$]: Qualified and highly effective personnel
- 21 will be recruited, developed, and retained.
- OBJECTIVE 7 [6]: The state's students will demonstrate
- 23 exemplary performance in comparison to national and international
- 24 standards.

- OBJECTIVE 8 [7]: School campuses will maintain a safe and
- 2 disciplined environment conducive to student learning.
- 3 OBJECTIVE 9 [8]: Educators will keep abreast of the
- 4 development of creative and innovative techniques in instruction
- 5 and administration using those techniques as appropriate to improve
- 6 student learning.
- 7 OBJECTIVE $\underline{10}$ [$\underline{9}$]: Technology will be implemented and used
- 8 to increase the effectiveness of student learning, instructional
- 9 management, staff development, and administration.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004
- 11 school year.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
