	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to participation by private school students in University
3	Interscholastic League sponsored activities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 33.087 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 33.087. PARTICIPATION BY PRIVATE SCHOOL STUDENTS IN
8	UNIVERSITY INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE ACTIVITIES. (a) The University
9	Interscholastic League may not deny a school or its students the
10	opportunity to participate in an activity sponsored by the league
11	or the opportunity to become a member of an appropriate league
12	district because the school is a private school.
13	(b) This section does not exempt a private school or its
14	students from satisfying each eligibility requirement imposed by
15	this subchapter or the University Interscholastic League for
16	participating in an activity or league district sponsored by the
17	league.
18	(c) A private school seeking to participate in a University
19	Interscholastic League activity or to become a member of a league
20	district must apply to the league on a signed form prescribed by the
21	league. The private school must certify its eligibility under this
22	subchapter and league rules in the application and must attach
23	proof of accreditation. The league may not impose eligibility
24	requirements for private schools that exceed the requirements of

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1	this subchapter or league rules for public schools or require proof
2	of eligibility that exceeds the proof required of public schools.
3	On approval of an application, the league shall issue a certificate
4	of approval to the applicant school. The application and
5	certificate of approval are governmental records for purposes of
6	Section 37.10, Penal Code.
7	(d) To determine the appropriate University Interscholastic
8	League district in which an eligible private school with a single
9	sex student enrollment will participate, the league must multiply
10	the private school's enrollment by two and place the private school
11	in an appropriate league district based on that enrollment figure,
12	provided that the private school is placed in a league district not
13	lower than the 3A level.
14	(e) For purposes of determining the eligibility of a student
15	to participate in a University Interscholastic League activity, the
16	attendance zone for an eligible private school is the geographic
17	area of the public school district in which the private school is
18	located.
19	(f) To be eligible under this section, a private school
20	<u>must:</u>
21	(1) be accredited by an accrediting organization
22	recognized by the Texas Education Agency;
23	(2) offer a four-year high school curriculum;
24	(3) offer interscholastic competition;
25	(4) require daily student attendance at a specific
26	location; and
27	(5) have an enrollment of not less than 500 students.

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SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004
school year.

3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
