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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the requirements for a high school diploma. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Sections 28.025(a), (c), and (d), Education 4 5 Code, as amended by Chapters 187 and 834, Acts of the 77th 6 Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, are amended and reenacted to read as follows: 7 The State Board of Education by rule shall determine 8 (a) curriculum requirements for the minimum, recommended, and advanced 9 high school programs that are consistent with the required 10 11 curriculum under Section 28.002. 12 (c) A person may receive a diploma if the person is eligible 13 for a diploma under Section 28.0251. In other cases, a [A] student 14 may graduate and receive a diploma only if: (1) the student successfully completes the curriculum 15 requirements identified by the State Board of Education under 16 Subsection (a) and: 17 18 complies with Section 39.025(a); or (A) (B) meets the alternative graduation criteria 19 prescribed under Section 28.0252; or 20 21 (2) the student successfully completes an 22 individualized education program developed under Section 29.005. 23 (d) A school district may issue a certificate of coursework completion to a student who successfully completes the curriculum 24

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requirements identified by the State Board of Education under 1 2 Subsection (a) but who fails to comply with Section 39.025(a) or the alternative graduation criteria under Section 28.0252. 3 A school 4 district may allow a student who receives a certificate to 5 participate in a graduation ceremony with students receiving high 6 school diplomas. SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, 7 is 8 amended by adding Section 28.0252 to read as follows: 9 Sec. 28.0252. ALTERNATIVE GRADUATION CRITERIA. (a) The commissioner by rule shall prescribe alternative graduation 10 criteria that a student may meet to graduate and receive a diploma 11 without complying with Section 39.025(a). The alternative 12 graduation criteria must be compensatory criteria. The alternative 13

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14 graduation criteria must include a student's:

15 (1) grade point average beginning in grade 9;

16 (2) current class ranking;

17 (3) performance on the individual assessment 18 instruments specified in Section 39.025(a);

19 (4) combined scores, using only the student's highest
20 scores, on the assessment instruments specified in Section
21 <u>39.025(a); and</u>

22 (5) overall academic performance beginning in grade 9, 23 as evaluated by two or more of the student's teachers.

(b) A committee composed of the student's high school principal or the principal's designee and two certified teachers in the student's school district who teach at the high school level shall determine whether a student who has not complied with Section

39.025(a) has met the alternative graduation criteria prescribed 1 2 under Subsection (a). The commissioner shall adopt rules relating to the selection and operation of a committee under this 3 subsection, including the method by which the committee must notify 4 5 the student and the student's high school registrar, or the person 6 performing the duties of a registrar, of the committee's decision. (c) A committee established under Subsection (b) shall 7 determine whether a student who has not complied with Section 8 9 39.025(a) has met the alternative graduation criteria prescribed 10 under Subsection (a): (1) following the first administration to the student 11 12 of the assessment instruments specified in Section 39.025(a); (2) on written request of the student's parent or 13 14 guardian, not more than one time in each school year following the 15 school year in which the assessment instruments specified in Section 39.025(a) are first administered to the student; and 16 17 (3) when the principal of the student's high school, or the principal's designee, determines that the student is within one 18 month of completing each requirement for a high school diploma 19 other than compliance with Section 39.025(a). 20 SECTION 3. (a) Section 28.025, Education Code, as amended 21 by this Act, and Section 28.0252, Education Code, as added by this 22 Act, apply beginning with the 2004-2005 school year. 23

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(b) Not later than June 1, 2004, the commissioner of
education shall adopt rules as required by Sections 28.0252(a) and
(b), Education Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

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
