4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 156.401, Family Code, is amended by

6 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:

- 7 (e) The rendering of a judgment or order for the confinement
- 8 of an obligor in a local, state, or federal jail or prison for a
- 9 period of at least 90 consecutive days is a material and substantial
- 10 change in circumstances for purposes of Subsection (a)(1). On the
- obligor's request, the court shall order that the obligor's child
- 12 support obligations be suspended during the obligor's period of
- confinement unless the court finds that the obligor has resources,
- 14 other than resources attributable to earnings for personal
- 15 services, available to pay those obligations.
- SECTION 2. Section 156.401(e), Family Code, as added by
- 17 this Act, applies only to a suit for modification of a child support
- order that is filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 19 suit for modification that is filed before the effective date of
- 20 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the suit was
- 21 filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
