- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 392, Local Government
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 392.067 to read as follows:
- Sec. 392.067. ENFORCEMENT BY PEACE OFFICERS. (a) A
- 8 <u>housing authority may commission and employ peace officers.</u>
- 9 (b) A peace officer commissioned under this section may make
 10 an arrest as necessary to prevent or abate the commission of an
 11 offense that:
- 12 <u>(1) occurs on property owned or controlled by the</u>
 13 housing authority; or
- (2) involves injury or detriment to property owned or controlled by the housing authority.
- 16 (c) A person employed as a peace officer under this section
 17 has the powers, privileges, and immunities of a peace officer while
 18 performing the person's duties under this section.
- 19 (d) A peace officer, before beginning to perform any duties
 20 and at the time of appointment, must take an oath and execute a bond
 21 payable to the housing authority in the amount of \$1,000 and
 22 conditioned on faithful performance of the officer's duties. The
 23 oath and the bond must be filed with the authority.
