A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to reducing class size when the students of a certain
- 3 grade level perform poorly on an assessment instrument.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.112(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) Except as otherwise authorized by this section and
- 8 <u>except as provided by Section 25.114</u>, a school district may not
- 9 enroll more than 22 students in a kindergarten, first, second,
- 10 third, or fourth grade class. That limitation does not apply
- 11 during:
- 12 (1) any 12-week period of the school year selected by
- 13 the district, in the case of a district whose average daily
- 14 attendance is adjusted under Section 42.005(c); or
- 15 (2) the last 12 weeks of any school year in the case of
- 16 any other district.
- 17 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 25, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 25.114 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 25.114. MANDATORY CLASS SIZE REDUCTION. If 50 percent
- 20 or more of the students at the third, fourth, or fifth grade level
- 21 at a campus do not perform satisfactorily on an assessment
- instrument administered under Section 39.023(a), for the following
- 23 school year and each school year thereafter until a majority of
- 24 those students whose combined performance triggered a class size

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- 1 reduction under this section complete the sixth grade, the campus
- 2 may not enroll those students in a class the size of which exceeds
- 3 75 percent of the usual class size for that grade level at that
- 4 campus.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2004-2005
- 6 school year.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
