A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the computation of public school dropout and completion
- 3 rates.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.051(b), Education Code, as amended by
- 6 Chapters 8, 725, 834, and 1420, Acts of the 77th Legislature,
- 7 Regular Session, 2001, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Performance on the indicators adopted under this
- 9 section shall be compared to state-established standards. The
- 10 degree of change from one school year to the next in performance on
- 11 each indicator adopted under this section shall also be considered.
- 12 The indicators must be based on information that is disaggregated
- 13 by race, ethnicity, gender, and socioeconomic status and must
- 14 include:
- 15 (1) the results of assessment instruments required
- under Sections 39.023(a), (c), and (1), aggregated by grade level
- 17 and subject area;
- 18 (2) dropout rates, including dropout rates and
- 19 district completion rates for grade levels 9 through 12, computed
- 20 in accordance with standards and definitions adopted by the
- 21 National Center for Education Statistics of the United States
- 22 Department of Education;
- 23 (3) student attendance rates;
- 24 (4) the percentage of graduating students who attain

- 1 scores on the secondary exit-level assessment instruments required
- 2 under Subchapter B that are equivalent to a passing score on the
- 3 test instrument required under Section 51.306;
- 4 (5) the percentage of graduating students who meet the
- 5 course requirements established for the recommended high school
- 6 program by State Board of Education rule;
- 7 (6) the results of the Scholastic Assessment Test
- 8 (SAT), the American College Test (ACT), articulated postsecondary
- 9 degree programs described by Section 61.852, and certified
- 10 workforce training programs described by Chapter 311, Labor Code;
- 11 (7) the percentage of students, aggregated by grade
- 12 level, provided accelerated instruction under Section 28.0211(c),
- 13 the results of assessments administered under that section, the
- 14 percentage of students promoted through the grade placement
- 15 committee process under Section 28.0211, the subject of the
- 16 assessment instrument on which each student failed to perform
- 17 satisfactorily, and the performance of those students in the school
- 18 year following that promotion on the assessment instruments
- 19 required under Section 39.023;
- 20 (8) for students who have failed to perform
- 21 satisfactorily on an assessment instrument required under Section
- 39.023(a) or (c), the numerical progress of those students on
- 23 subsequent assessment instruments required under those sections,
- 24 aggregated by grade level and subject area;
- 25 [(9) the percentage of students taking end-of-course
- 26 assessment instruments adopted under Section 39.023(d);
- 27 (9) the percentage of students exempted, by exemption

- 1 category, from the assessment program generally applicable under
- 2 this chapter [subchapter]; and
- 3 (10) $[\frac{(11)}{(11)}]$ the percentage of students of limited
- 4 English proficiency exempted from the administration of an
- 5 assessment instrument under Sections 39.027(a)(3) and (4).
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 39.051(b), Education Code, as amended by
- 7 this Act, applies beginning with the 2003-2004 school year.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
