## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to requiring voter approval for the issuance by a 3 municipality or county of certain certificates of obligation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 271.049, Local Government Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (e) to read as follows:

- (a) Regardless of the sources of payment of certificates, certificates may not be issued unless the issuer publishes notice of its intention to issue the certificates. The notice must be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper, as defined by Subchapter C, Chapter 2051, Government Code, that is of general circulation in the area of the issuer, with the date of the first publication to be before the 30th [14th] day before the date tentatively set for the passage of the order or ordinance authorizing the issuance of the certificates.
- (b-1) Certificates may not be issued unless the issuer, in addition to publishing the notice required under Subsection (a), sends a press release of its intention to issue the certificates to major television, radio, and newsprint media in the area before the 30th day before the date tentatively set for the passage of the order or ordinance authorizing the issuance of the certificates.
- 23 (c) If before the date tentatively set for the authorization 24 of the issuance of the certificates or if before the

- receives a petition signed by the number of registered [at least
- 4 five percent of the qualified] voters provided by Subsection (e)

- 7 the issuance is approved at an election ordered, held,
- 8 conducted in the manner provided for bond elections under Chapter
- 9 1251, Government Code.

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- The number of signatures required for a petition under 10
- Subsection (c) is a number equal to at least two percent of the 11
- number of votes cast for all candidates for governor in the most 12
- recent gubernatorial election held in the issuing county or 13
- 14 municipality, as appropriate.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 271.0525(c), Local Government Code, is
- amended to read as follows: 16
- 17 (c) A petition to protest the issuance of refinancing
- certificates under this section must be signed by a number of 18
- qualified voters, residing in the county, equal to at least two 19
- [five] percent of the number of votes cast in that county for 20
- 21 governor in the most recent general election at which that office
- was filled. 22
- 23 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 24 certificates of obligation for which the authorizing ordinance or
- order is adopted on or after the effective date of this Act. 25
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
