- SECTION 2. Sections 2306.6718(b) and (d), Government Code, are repealed.
- SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
  to an application for a low income housing tax credit filed on or
  after the effective date of this Act. An application filed before
  the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when
  the application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect
  for that purpose.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
