6	SECTION 1. Section 171.003(a), Local Government Code, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	(a) A local public official commits an offense if the

10	(1) violates Section 171.004 <u>or 171.0041</u> ;
11	(2) acts as surety for a business entity that has work,
12	business, or a contract with the governmental entity; or
13	(3) acts as surety on any official bond required of an
14	officer of the governmental entity.
15	SECTION 2. Chapter 171, Local Government Code, is amended
16	by adding Section 171.0041 to read as follows:
17	Sec. 171.0041. CERTAIN SCHOOL DISTRICT CONTRACTS
18	PROHIBITED. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a school
19	district may not enter into a contract with a business entity in
20	which a district trustee has a substantial interest.
21	(b) A school district may enter into a contract with a
22	business entity in which a district trustee has a substantial
23	interest if:
24	(1) the board of trustees at an open meeting

1	determines, based on credible evidence, that:
2	(A) no other business entity within a 50-mile
3	radius of the school district's central administrative office is
4	capable of providing the same or better quality goods or services at
5	the same or lower cost; and
6	(B) the goods or services at issue are reasonably
7	priced; and
8	(2) each trustee who has a substantial interest in the
9	business entity complies with Section 171.004.
10	SECTION 3. Section 171.0041, Local Government Code, as
11	added by this Act, applies only to a contract executed on or after
12	September 1, 2003. A contract executed before September 1, 2003, is
13	governed by the law as it existed on the date the contract was
14	executed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
15	purpose.
16	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
