11	exemption filed with a chief appraiser is confidential and not open
12	to public inspection. The information may not be disclosed to
13	anyone other than an employee of the appraisal office who appraises
14	property, except as authorized by Subsection (b).
15	(b) Information made confidential by this section may be
16	disclosed:
17	(1) in a judicial or administrative proceeding
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- pursuant to a lawful subpoena; 18
- 19 (2) to the person who filed the application or to the
- person's representative authorized in writing to receive the 20

- 22 (3) to the comptroller and the comptroller's employees
- 23 authorized by the comptroller in writing to receive the information
- 24 or to an assessor or a chief appraiser if requested in writing;

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(4) in a judicial or administrative proceeding 1 2 relating to property taxation to which the person who filed the 3 application is a party; or 4 (5) if and to the extent the information is required to 5 be included in a public document or record that the appraisal office 6 is required by law to prepare or maintain. 7 (c) A person who legally has access to an application for an exemption or who legally obtains the information from the 8 application made confidential by this section commits an offense if 9 the person knowingly: 10 11 (1) permits inspection of the confidential information by a person not authorized by Subsection (b) to inspect 12 the information; or 13 (2) discloses the confidential information to a person 14 15 not authorized by Subsection (b) to receive the information. 16 (d) An offense under Subsection (c) is a Class B
