1-8 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-9 AN ACT

1-10 relating to the issuance of special license plates for federal
1-11 administrative law judges.

1-12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-13 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 502, Transportation Code,
1-14 is amended by adding Section 502.2971 to read as follows:

1-15 Sec. 502.2971. FEDERAL ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGES. (a) The
1-16 department shall issue specially designed license plates for a
1-17 passenger car or light truck owned by a federal administrative law
1-18 judge or a retired federal administrative law judge.

1-19 (b) License plates issued under this section must include
1-20 the words "U.S. A.L. Judge."

1-21 (c) The department shall issue license plates under this
1-22 section to a person who:

1-23 (1) applies to the department on a form prescribed by
1-24 the department;

1-25 (2) furnishes evidence acceptable to the department
1-26 that the person is eligible to register the vehicle under this
1-27 section; and

1-28 (3) pays the fee prescribed by Section 502.161.

1-29 (d) A person may be issued three sets of license plates
1-30 under this section.

1-31 (e) A registration under this section is for a registration
1-32 period of 12 consecutive months or until March 31, whichever period
1-33 is shorter.

1-34 (f) If the owner of a vehicle registered under this section
1-35 disposes of the vehicle during the registration period, the owner
1-36 shall surrender the special license plates to the department.

1-37 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
