A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the eligibility of a person to operate a commercial
3	motor vehicle in this state.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 522.003(25), Transportation Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(25) "Serious traffic violation" means:
8	$\overline{(A)}$ a conviction arising from the driving of a
9	[commercial] motor vehicle, other than a parking, vehicle weight,
10	or vehicle defect violation, for:
11	$\underline{\text{(i)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(A)}}{\text{(A)}}$] excessive speeding, involving a
12	single charge of driving 15 miles per hour or more above the posted
13	speed limit;
14	$\underline{\text{(ii)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(B)}}{\text{)}}$] reckless driving, as defined by
15	state or local law;
16	$\underline{\text{(iii)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(C)}}{\text{)}}$] a violation of a state or local
17	law related to motor vehicle traffic control, including a law
18	regulating the operation of vehicles on highways, arising ir
19	connection with a fatal accident;
20	$\underline{\text{(iv)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(D)}}{\text{D}}$] improper or erratic traffic lane
21	change;
22	$\underline{\text{(v)}}$ [$\overline{\text{(E)}}$] following the vehicle ahead too
23	closely; or

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(vi) [(F) operating] a [commercial motor

- 1 vehicle in violation of Section 522.011; or
- 2 (B) a violation of Section [or] 522.015.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 522.081, Transportation Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 522.081. DISQUALIFICATION. (a) This subsection
- 6 applies [only] to a violation committed while operating any motor
- 7 <u>vehicle, including</u> a commercial motor vehicle. A person <u>who holds a</u>
- 8 <u>commercial driver's license</u> is disqualified from driving a
- 9 commercial motor vehicle for:
- 10 (1) 60 days if convicted of:
- 11 (A) two serious traffic violations that occur
- 12 within a three-year period; or
- 13 (B) one violation of a law that regulates the
- operation of a motor vehicle at a railroad grade crossing; or
- 15 (2) 120 days if convicted of:
- 16 (A) three serious traffic violations arising
- 17 from separate incidents occurring within a three-year period; or
- 18 (B) two violations of a law that regulates the
- 19 operation of a motor vehicle at a railroad grade crossing that occur
- 20 within a three-year period[; or
- 21 [(3) one year if convicted of three violations of a law
- 22 that regulates the operation of a motor vehicle at a railroad grade
- 23 crossing that occur within a three-year period].
- 24 (b) This subsection applies to a violation committed while
- operating any motor vehicle, including a commercial motor vehicle,
- 26 except as provided by this subsection. A person who holds a
- 27 <u>commercial driver's license</u> is disqualified from driving a

2 (1) if convicted of three violations of a law that regulates the operation of a motor vehicle at a railroad grade 3 crossing that occur within a three-year period; 4 5 (2) on first conviction of: 6 (A) [(1)] driving a [commercial] motor vehicle 7 under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance, including 8 a violation of Section 49.04 or 49.07, Penal Code; (B) [(2) driving a commercial motor vehicle 9 while the person's alcohol concentration was 0.04 or more; 10 [(3) intentionally] leaving the scene of an accident 11 involving a [commercial] motor vehicle driven by the person; 12 (C) [(4)] using a [commercial] motor vehicle in 13 14 the commission of a felony, other than a felony described by 15 Subsection (d)(2); (D) [(5) refusing to submit to a test to 16 17 determine the person's alcohol concentration or the presence in the person's body of a controlled substance or drug while driving a 18 19 commercial motor vehicle; $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ causing the death of another person through the 20 negligent or criminal operation of a [commercial] motor vehicle; or 21 (E) $[\frac{(7)}{1}]$ driving a commercial motor vehicle 22 while the person's commercial driver's license is revoked, 23 24 suspended, or canceled, or while the person is disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle, for an action or conduct that 25 26 occurred while operating a commercial motor vehicle; 27 (3) for refusing to submit to a test under Chapter 724

commercial motor vehicle for one year:

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- 1 to determine the person's alcohol concentration or the presence in
- 2 the person's body of a controlled substance or drug while operating
- 3 a motor vehicle in a public place; or
- 4 (4) if an analysis of the person's blood, breath, or
- 5 urine under Chapter 724 determines that the person:
- 6 (A) had an alcohol concentration of 0.04 or more,
- 7 or that a controlled substance or drug was present in the person's
- 8 body, while operating a commercial motor vehicle in a public place;
- 9 <u>or</u>
- 10 (B) had an alcohol concentration of 0.08 or more
- 11 while operating a motor vehicle, other than a commercial motor
- 12 vehicle, in a public place.
- 13 (c) A person who holds a commercial driver's license is
- 14 disqualified from operating a commercial motor vehicle for three
- 15 <u>years if:</u>
- 16 (1) the person:
- 17 (A) is convicted of an offense [If a violation]
- 18 listed in Subsection (b)(2) and the vehicle being operated by the
- 19 person was transporting a hazardous material required to be
- 20 placarded; or
- 21 (B) refuses to submit to a test under Chapter 724
- 22 to determine the person's alcohol concentration or the presence in
- 23 the person's body of a controlled substance or drug while operating
- 24 a motor vehicle in a public place and the vehicle being operated by
- 25 the person was transporting a hazardous material required to be
- 26 placarded; or
- 27 (2) an analysis of the person's blood, breath, or urine

- 1 under Chapter 724 determines that while transporting a hazardous
- 2 material required to be placarded the person:
- 3 (A) while operating a commercial motor vehicle in
- 4 a public place had an alcohol concentration of 0.04 or more, or a
- 5 controlled substance or drug present in the person's body; or
- 6 (B) while operating a motor vehicle, other than a
- 7 commercial motor vehicle, in a public place had an alcohol
- 8 <u>concentration of 0.08 or more</u> [(b) occurred while the person was
- 9 transporting a hazardous material required to be placarded, the
- 10 person is disqualified for three years].
- 11 (d) A person is disqualified from driving a commercial motor
- 12 vehicle for life:
- 13 (1) if the person [\div
- 14 [\(\frac{(1)}{1}\)] is convicted [\(\frac{\text{of}}{1}\)] two or more times [\(\frac{\text{violations}}{1}\)]
- of an offense specified by Subsection (b)(2) [(b)], or a
- 16 combination of those offenses, arising from two or more separate
- 17 incidents; [or]
- 18 (2) if the person uses a [commercial] motor vehicle in
- 19 the commission of a felony involving:
- 20 (A) the manufacture, distribution, or dispensing
- 21 of a controlled substance; or
- 22 (B) possession with intent to manufacture,
- distribute, or dispense a controlled substance; or
- 24 (3) for any combination of two or more of the
- 25 following, arising from two or more separate incidents:
- 26 (A) a conviction of the person for an offense
- 27 described by Subsection (b)(2);

- 1 (B) a refusal by the person described by
- 2 Subsection (b)(3); and
- 3 (C) an analysis of the person's blood, breath, or
- 4 urine described by Subsection (b)(4).
- 5 (e) A person may not be issued a commercial driver's license
- 6 if, in connection with the person's operation of a commercial motor
- 7 vehicle, the person commits an offense or engages in conduct that
- 8 would disqualify the holder of a commercial driver's license from
- 9 operating a commercial motor vehicle, or is determined to have had
- an alcohol concentration of 0.04 or more or to have had a controlled
- 11 substance or drug present in the person's body. The period of
- 12 prohibition under this subsection is equal to the appropriate
- period of disqualification required by Subsections (a)-(d).
- (f) In this section, "felony" means an offense under state or
- 15 federal law that is punishable by death or imprisonment for a term
- of more than one year.
- 17 SECTION 3. Section 522.087, Transportation Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 522.087. PROCEDURES APPLICABLE TO DISQUALIFICATION.
- 20 (a) A person is automatically disqualified under Section
- 21 522.081(a)(1)(B), Section 522.081(b)(2) [522.081(b)(1), (3), (4),
- (6), or (7)], or Section 522.081(d)(2). An appeal may not be taken
- 23 from the disqualification.
- (b) Disqualifying a person under Section 522.081(a), other
- 25 than under Subdivision (1)(B) of that subsection, Section
- 26 522.081(b)(1), or Section 522.081(d)(1) or (3) is subject to the
- 27 notice and hearing procedures of Sections 521.295-521.303. An

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- 1 appeal of the disqualification is subject to Section 521.308.
- 2 SECTION 4. (a) This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- Sections 522.081 and 522.087, Transportation Code, as 3 4 amended by this Act, apply only to conduct that is engaged in or to 5 an offense that is committed on or after the effective date of this 6 Act. Conduct that is engaged in or an offense committed before the 7 effective date of this Act is governed by Sections 522.081 and 522.087, Transportation Code, 8 as those sections existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former 9

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law is continued in effect for that purpose.
