Section 19.03(a), Penal Code, is amended to read 9 as follows: 10 A person commits an offense if the person [he] commits 11 (a) 12 murder as defined under Section 19.02(b)(1) and: 13 (1) the person murders a peace officer or fireman who is acting in the lawful discharge of an official duty and who the 14 person knows is a peace officer or fireman; 15 the person intentionally commits the murder in the 16 (2) course of committing or attempting to commit kidnapping, burglary, 17 18 robbery, aggravated sexual assault, arson, or obstruction or retaliation; 19 the person commits the murder for remuneration or 20 (3) 21 the promise of remuneration or employs another to commit the murder 22 for remuneration or the promise of remuneration; (4) the person commits the murder while escaping or 23 24 attempting to escape from a penal institution;

No. 563 1 (5) the person, while incarcerated in a penal 2 institution, murders another: 3 (A) who is employed in the operation of the penal 4 institution; or 5 (B) with the intent to establish, maintain, or 6 participate in a combination or in the profits of a combination; 7 (6) the person: while incarcerated for an offense under this 8 (A) section or Section 19.02, murders another; or 9 10 (B) while serving a sentence of life imprisonment or a term of 99 years for an offense under Section 20.04, 22.021, or 11 12 29.03, murders another; the person murders more than one person: 13 (7) 14 (A) during the same criminal transaction; or 15 (B) during different criminal transactions but the murders are committed pursuant to the same scheme or course of 16 17 conduct; [or] (8) the person murders an individual under six years 18 19 of age; or (9) the person murders a commissioned security officer 20 21 while the officer is performing a duty as a security officer and is wearing a distinctive uniform or badge indicating the person's 22 status as a commissioned security officer. 23 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and 25 applies only to an offense committed on or after that date. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is covered 26 by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former 27
