4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Sections 2(c) and (j), Chapter 88, Acts of the
6	77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001 (Article 6243h, Vernon's
7	Texas Civil Statutes), are amended to read as follows:
8	(c) The pension board consists of $\underline{ ext{nine}}$ [$rac{11}{1}$] trustees as
9	follows:
10	(1) the mayor of the city, or the director of the civil
11	service commission as the mayor's representative;
12	(2) the city treasurer or a person performing the
13	duties of treasurer;
14	(3) four municipal employees of the city who are
15	members of the pension system;
16	(4) two retirees, each of whom:
17	(A) has at least five years of credited service
18	in the pension system;
19	(B) receives a retirement pension from the
20	pension system; and
21	(C) is not an officer or employee of the city;

(5) <u>one person who</u> [three persons, each of whom]:

(A) [is a registered voter in the city;

- [(B)] has been a resident of this state [the 2 city] for the three years preceding the date of initial appointment; and
- 4 (B) $\left[\frac{(C)}{C}\right]$ is not a city officer or employee.
- 5 (j) To serve as a trustee under Subsection (c)(5) of this 6 section, the [a] person must be appointed by a vote of a majority of the elected trustees of the pension board [the governing body of the 7 8 city]. The [Each] trustee appointed under Subsection (c)(5) of 9 this section serves a two-year term. The appointment reappointment of [both] the appointed trustee [trustees] shall take 10 place in January of each even-numbered year. The appointed trustee 11 may be removed at any time by a vote of a majority of the elected 12 trustees of the pension board. A vacancy caused by the [an] 13 appointed trustee's death, resignation, or removal shall be filled 14 15 by the <u>elected trustees of the pension board</u> [governing body of the city]. The appointee serves for the remainder of the unexpired term 16 17 of the replaced trustee. An appointed trustee may not serve beyond the expiration of the two-year term other than by appointment for a 18 new term by the elected trustees of the pension board [governing 19 body of the city]. 20
- SECTION 2. Section 3, Chapter 88, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001 (Article 6243h, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended by adding Subsection (n) to read as follows:
- 25 <u>(n) Notwithstanding any other law, the pension board may</u>
 26 <u>enter into a written agreement with the city regarding pension</u>
 27 issues and benefits. The agreement must be approved by the pension

- 1 board and signed by the mayor and by the pension board or the
- 2 pension board's designee. The agreement is enforceable against and
- 3 binding on the city and the pension system's members, retirees,
- 4 deferred participants, beneficiaries, eligible survivors, and
- 5 alternate payees. The agreement may not alter the composition of
- 6 the pension board, reduce the amount of an earned benefit under this
- 7 article, reduce the benefit accrual rates or maximum allowable
- 8 pension under Section 10 of this article, or lengthen the schedule
- 9 for retirement eligibility under Section 10(b) of this article.
- 10 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 15, Chapter 88, Acts of
- 11 the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001 (Article 6243h,
- 12 Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 15. [ANNUITY] INCREASE IN BENEFITS.
- SECTION 4. Section 15, Chapter 88, Acts of the 77th
- 15 Legislature, Regular Session, 2001 (Article 6243h, Vernon's Texas
- 16 Civil Statutes), is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 17 follows:
- 18 (d) A pension benefit or allowance provided by this article
- 19 may be increased if:
- 20 (1) a qualified actuary selected by the pension board
- 21 determines that the increase cannot reasonably be considered to
- 22 jeopardize the pension system's ability to pay any existing
- 23 benefit;
- 24 (2) the increase is approved by the pension board and
- 25 the city in a written agreement as provided by Section 3(n) of this
- 26 article; and
- 27 (3) the increase does not deprive a member or retiree,

- 1 without the written consent of the member or retiree, from
- 2 receiving the immediate or deferred retirement benefit that the
- 3 member or retiree was eligible to receive under this article before
- 4 the increase.
- 5 SECTION 5. The terms of the appointed trustees serving
- 6 under Section 2(c)(5), Chapter 88, Acts of the 77th Legislature,
- 7 Regular Session, 2001 (Article 6243h, Vernon's Texas Civil
- 8 Statutes), on the effective date of this Act expire on that date.
- 9 Not later than October 1, 2003, a pension board shall appoint or
- 10 reappoint a trustee to reflect the changes made by this Act to
- 11 Section 2, Chapter 88, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular
- 12 Session, 2001 (Article 6243h, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), for a
- term expiring in January 2004, as provided by Section 2(j), Chapter
- 14 88, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001 (Article
- 15 6243h, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), as amended by this Act.
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
