H.B. No. 603

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the regulation of crematories, cemeteries, and funeral homes; providing a penalty.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 651.001, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subdivisions (5) and (7) and adding Subdivision (16-a) to read as follows:

(5) "First call" means the beginning of the relationship and duty of a funeral director to take charge of a dead human body and have the body prepared for burial or disposition by embalming, cremation, or another method. The term does not include:

(A) an ambulance call if the person dispatching the ambulance does not know whether a dead human body is to be picked up; or

(B) the removal of a body for an autopsy or inquest under Chapter 49, Code of Criminal Procedure, as ordered or directed by a justice of the peace, death investigator, peace officer, or medical examiner.

(7) "Funeral directing" means acts associated with or arranging for the disposition of a dead human body ~~performed by~~ a person for compensation, including the acts described by Section 651.0015 ~~[from the time of first call until:~~

~~[(A) inurnment, interment, or entombment services are complete; or~~

1                   ~~[(B) the body is permanently transported out of~~  
2 ~~this state].~~

3                   (16-a) "Trainee license holder" means a person who:

4                   (A) is engaged in learning the practice of  
5 funeral directing or embalming under the instruction, direction,  
6 and personal supervision of a funeral director or embalmer; and

7                   (B) holds a trainee license issued by the  
8 commission under this chapter.

9                   SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is  
10 amended by adding Section 651.0015 to read as follows:

11                   Sec. 651.0015. PRACTICE OF FUNERAL DIRECTING. (a) The  
12 practice of funeral directing consists of acts performed by a  
13 funeral director from the time of first call until:

14                   (1) inurnment, interment, or entombment services are  
15 complete; or

16                   (2) the body is permanently transported out of this  
17 state.

18                   (b) The practice of funeral directing includes acts  
19 performed by a funeral director at the request of the family member  
20 or other person responsible for making arrangements for the final  
21 disposition of the deceased or of a governmental entity responsible  
22 for disposing of dead human bodies to:

23                   (1) direct the funeral service of the deceased;

24                   (2) inform the family member or other person  
25 responsible for making funeral arrangements that a contract will  
26 exist between the funeral director and the family member or other  
27 person;

1           (3) provide consumer information, including  
2 brochures, price lists, and funeral purchase agreements;

3           (4) sign the funeral purchase agreement;

4           (5) assist in the selection of funeral merchandise and  
5 other goods and services;

6           (6) obtain the information required for the issuance  
7 of a death certificate and file the death certificate;

8           (7) obtain or file other documents required by law,  
9 including permits;

10          (8) coordinate with a cemetery or crematory for the  
11 disposal of remains;

12          (9) ensure the proper burial or disposal of remains;

13          (10) supervise disinterment and removal of remains  
14 from a place of interment; and

15          (11) communicate with the deceased's family or other  
16 representatives regarding the acts described by this section.

17           SECTION 3. Section 651.151(b), Occupations Code, is amended  
18 to read as follows:

19           (b) The commission shall examine each applicant for a  
20 funeral director's license, embalmer's license, [~~or~~] provisional  
21 license, or trainee license and shall issue the appropriate license  
22 to a person who meets the licensing requirements.

23           SECTION 4. Section 651.152, Occupations Code, is amended to  
24 read as follows:

25           Sec. 651.152. RULES; PROCEDURES; FORMS; STANDARDS OF  
26 CONDUCT. (a) The commission may:

27           (1) adopt rules, establish procedures, and prescribe

1 forms necessary to administer and enforce this chapter; and

2 (2) adopt rules relating to the final disposition of a  
3 dead human body under Chapters 713, 714, and 715, Health and Safety  
4 Code.

5 (b) The commission by rule shall establish standards of  
6 professional conduct and ethical behavior for a license holder  
7 under this chapter.

8 SECTION 5. Section 651.154, Occupations Code, is amended to  
9 read as follows:

10 Sec. 651.154. FEES. (a) The commission shall set the  
11 following fees in amounts reasonable and necessary to administer  
12 this chapter:

13 (1) the funeral director's and embalmer's application  
14 fee, license fee, duplicate license fee, and the fee for a  
15 reciprocal license under Section 651.259 [~~fee~~]; and

16 (2) the funeral establishment license fee, renewal  
17 fee, and late renewal penalty.

18 (b) The commission shall set the trainee [~~provisional~~]  
19 license fee, examination fee, renewal fee, and late renewal penalty  
20 in amounts reasonable and necessary to administer the trainee  
21 [~~provisional~~] license program.

22 (c) The commission shall set fees under this chapter in  
23 amounts sufficient to cover the costs of:

24 (1) processing duplicate, replacement, or additional  
25 license renewal applications;

26 (2) issuing licenses and wall certificates;

27 (3) conducting audits to determine whether an

1 applicant meets the requirements for a provisional or trainee  
2 license;  
3 (4) preparing consumer brochures;  
4 (5) preparing mortuary law books;  
5 (6) collecting penalties for insufficient funds  
6 checks; and  
7 (7) providing postage associated with services  
8 provided under this chapter.

9 SECTION 6. Sections 651.157(b) and (e), Occupations Code,  
10 are amended to read as follows:

11 (b) If the commission finds a violation of this chapter, ~~[ex~~  
12 ~~of]~~ Chapter 193 or 361, Health and Safety Code, or the rules adopted  
13 by the Texas Department of Health under those chapters, the  
14 commission shall inspect the funeral establishment annually until  
15 the commission determines that the establishment is free of  
16 violations.

17 (e) A premises on which funeral directing or embalming is  
18 practiced, regardless of whether the premises are open to the  
19 public, and all funeral purchase agreements and retail price lists  
20 shall be open at all times to inspection for any violation of this  
21 chapter, ~~[ex of]~~ Chapter 193 or 361, Health and Safety Code, or a  
22 rule adopted by the Texas Department of Health under those chapters  
23 by:

24 (1) an agent of the commission;  
25 (2) an authorized agent of the state; or  
26 (3) an authorized agent of the county or municipality  
27 in which the premises is located.

1 SECTION 7. Section 651.1575(a), Occupations Code, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 (a) The commission may inspect a cemetery or crematory for a  
4 possible violation of this chapter or Chapters 711-715, Health and  
5 Safety Code [~~only if the commission receives a complaint about that~~  
6 ~~facility under Section 651.202~~].

7 SECTION 8. Section 651.159(a), Occupations Code, is amended  
8 to read as follows:

9 (a) The commission, the Texas Department of Insurance, and  
10 the Texas Department of Banking shall adopt a joint memorandum of  
11 understanding relating to prepaid funeral services and  
12 transactions. The memorandum must:

13 (1) outline the responsibilities of each agency in  
14 regulating prepaid funeral services and transactions;

15 (2) outline the responsibilities of each agency under  
16 Chapter 712, Health and Safety Code, and rules adopted by the Texas  
17 Department of Banking under that chapter;

18 (3) establish procedures to be used by each agency in:

19 (A) referring a complaint to one of the other  
20 agencies;

21 (B) investigating a complaint; and

22 (C) notifying the other agencies of a complaint  
23 or a complaint investigation;

24 (4) [~~3~~] specify:

25 (A) an action the agencies regard as a deceptive  
26 trade practice; and

27 (B) the information the agencies provide

1 consumers and when that information is to be provided; and

2 (5) [~~4~~] set the administrative penalty each agency  
3 imposes for a violation.

4 SECTION 9. Section 651.160(a), Occupations Code, is amended  
5 to read as follows:

6 (a) The commission and the Texas Department of Health shall  
7 adopt a joint memorandum of understanding that:

8 (1) outlines the responsibilities of each agency in  
9 enforcing requirements under Chapters 193, [~~and~~] 361, 694, and 711,  
10 Health and Safety Code, the rules adopted by the Texas Department of  
11 Health under those chapters, and rules adopted by the Texas  
12 Department of Health related to vital statistics [~~that affect~~  
13 ~~funeral establishments~~];

14 (2) establishes procedures by which each agency:

15 (A) may refer a complaint to the other; and

16 (B) will notify the other of a violation by a  
17 funeral establishment of Chapter 193 or 361, Health and Safety  
18 Code; and

19 (3) coordinates inspection and enforcement efforts by  
20 both agencies for measures that a funeral establishment is required  
21 to implement under Chapters 193 and 361, Health and Safety Code.

22 SECTION 10. Section 651.201(b), Occupations Code, is  
23 amended to read as follows:

24 (b) The commission shall:

25 (1) for a fee provide each licensed funeral  
26 establishment with the number of brochures the commission considers  
27 appropriate; and

1           (2) make the brochure available to the public and  
2 appropriate state agencies.

3           SECTION 11. Section 651.251, Occupations Code, is amended  
4 to read as follows:

5           Sec. 651.251. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) Funeral directing may  
6 be performed only by a funeral director or a provisional license  
7 holder, trainee license holder, or qualified mortuary student under  
8 the supervision and direction of a funeral director. A person may  
9 not engage or profess to be engaged in the business of funeral  
10 directing or hold the person out to the public as a funeral director  
11 unless the person is licensed as a funeral director.

12           (b) Embalming may be performed only by an embalmer or a  
13 provisional license holder, trainee license holder, or qualified  
14 mortuary student under the supervision and direction of an  
15 embalmer. A person may not engage or profess to be engaged in the  
16 business of embalming or hold the person out to the public as an  
17 embalmer unless the person is licensed as an embalmer.

18           SECTION 12. Section 651.253, Occupations Code, is amended  
19 to read as follows:

20           Sec. 651.253. GENERAL LICENSE REQUIREMENTS. (a) To be  
21 eligible for a funeral director's license or an embalmer's license,  
22 an applicant must:

- 23           (1) be at least 18 years of age;
- 24           (2) have graduated from an accredited high school or  
25 passed an examination prescribed by the Texas Education Agency;
- 26           (3) have graduated from an accredited school or  
27 college of mortuary science;



1 (4) unless the applicant holds a reciprocal funeral  
2 director's or embalmer's license under Section 651.259, have served  
3 as a trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder for not less than one year  
4 under the personal supervision and instruction of a funeral  
5 director or embalmer, as applicable; and

6 (5) have successfully completed the applicable  
7 written examination described by Section 651.254 or 651.255 [~~or~~  
8 ~~651.256~~].

9 (b) An applicant for a funeral director's license or an  
10 embalmer's license may not be considered for that license until the  
11 applicant [+

12 [~~(1)~~] completes all of the requirements of the trainee  
13 [~~provisional~~] license program[; and

14 [~~(2) attains a grade of at least 75 percent on the~~  
15 ~~written examination given by the commission~~].

16 SECTION 13. Sections 651.254 and 651.255, Occupations Code,  
17 are amended to read as follows:

18 Sec. 651.254. PROVISIONAL OR RECIPROCAL LICENSE  
19 EXAMINATIONS[; RESULTS]. (a) To be eligible for a provisional  
20 license under Section 651.2595 or a reciprocal license under  
21 Section 651.259, the applicant must pay the examination fee set by  
22 the commission and pass a written examination administered and  
23 developed by the commission on:

24 (1) the law applicable to vital statistics pertaining  
25 to dead human bodies; and

26 (2) state and local laws and rules relating to the  
27 preparation, transportation, care, and disposition of dead human

1 bodies.

2 (b) An applicant must attain a passing score of at least 75  
3 percent on the written examination required by Subsection (a).

4 (c) The commission shall provide for the examinations for a  
5 provisional license or a reciprocal [funeral director's license and  
6 an embalmer's] license under Section 651.259 to [shall] be held at  
7 least quarterly [annually. The examinations shall be given at the  
8 time and place designated by the commission. The commission shall  
9 give notice of the examinations].

10 (d) The [(b) Not later than the 30th day after the date a  
11 person takes a licensing examination under this chapter, the  
12 commission shall notify the person of the results of the  
13 examination.

14 [(c) If the examination is graded or reviewed by a testing  
15 service:

16 [(1) the] commission shall notify the person of the  
17 results of the examination not later than the 14th day after the  
18 date the commission receives the examination results [from the  
19 testing service, and

20 [(2) if notice of the examination results will be  
21 delayed for longer than 90 days after the examination date, the  
22 commission shall notify the person of the reason for the delay  
23 before the 90th day.

24 [(d) The commission may require a testing service to notify  
25 a person of the results of the person's examination].

26 (e) If requested in writing by a person who fails the [a  
27 licensing] examination [administered under this chapter], the

1 commission shall furnish the person with an analysis of the  
2 person's performance on the examination.

3           Sec. 651.255. LICENSE EXAMINATIONS [~~REQUIRED FOR FUNERAL~~  
4 ~~DIRECTOR'S LICENSE~~]. (a) To be eligible for a license as a funeral  
5 director or embalmer under this chapter, an applicant must pass an  
6 examination administered or approved by the American Board of  
7 Funeral Service Education in conjunction with the International  
8 Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards or other entity  
9 designated by the [The] commission [~~shall administer or arrange for~~  
10 ~~the administration of.~~

11                   [~~(1) a written professionally prepared examination~~]

12 on:

- 13                   (1) [(A)] the art and technique of funeral directing;  
14                   (2) [(B)] the signs of death;  
15                   (3) [(C)] the manner by which death may be determined;  
16                   (4) [(D)] sanitation and hygiene;  
17                   (5) [(E)] mortuary management and mortuary law;  
18                   (6) [(F)] business and professional ethics; [and]  
19                   (7) the anatomy of the human body, including the  
20 cavities and the arterial and venous system of the human body;  
21                   (8) blood and discoloration;  
22                   (9) bacteriology and hygiene;  
23                   (10) pathology;  
24                   (11) chemistry and embalming;  
25                   (12) arterial and cavity embalming;  
26                   (13) restorative art;  
27                   (14) disinfecting;

1           (15) embalming special cases;

2           (16) contagious and infectious diseases;

3           (17) care, preservation, transportation, and  
4 disposition of dead human bodies;

5           (18) sanitary science; and

6           (19) [(C)] other subjects that may be taught in a

15           (b) An applicant must attain a passing score of at least 75  
16 percent on each subject described by Subsection (a).

17           (c) The commission shall notify the person of the results of  
18 the examination not later than the 14th day after the date the  
19 commission receives the results.

20           (d) If requested in writing by a person who fails a  
21 licensing examination administered under this chapter, the  
22 commission shall furnish the person with an analysis of the  
23 person's performance on the examination.

24           SECTION 14. Section 651.259(f), Occupations Code, is  
25 amended to read as follows:

26           (f) An applicant for a license under this section must:

27           (1) provide proof that:

1 (A) the license is in good standing;  
2 (B) the applicant has practiced under the license  
3 for at least:

4 (i) one year in the state that issued the  
5 license if that state has license requirements substantially  
6 equivalent to those of this state; or

7 (ii) five years in the state that issued the  
8 license if that state does not have license requirements  
9 substantially equivalent to those of this state; and

10 (C) the applicant has graduated from an  
11 accredited college of mortuary science; and

12 (2) pass a written examination of not more than 50  
13 questions on applicable state laws and commission rules as provided  
14 by Section 651.254.

15 SECTION 15. The heading to Subchapter G, Chapter 651,  
16 Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

17 SUBCHAPTER G. LICENSE REQUIREMENTS: TRAINEE

19 SECTION 16. Sections 651.301-651.305, Occupations Code,  
20 are amended to read as follows:

21 Sec. 651.301. TRAINEE [~~PROVISIONAL~~] LICENSE REQUIRED. A  
22 person must obtain a trainee [~~provisional~~] license before the  
23 person may engage in learning the practice of funeral directing or  
24 embalming under the instruction, direction, and personal  
25 supervision in this state of a licensed funeral director or  
26 embalmer.

27 Sec. 651.302. APPLICATION; ISSUANCE OF TRAINEE

1 ~~[PROVISIONAL]~~ LICENSE. (a) The commission shall issue a trainee  
2 ~~[provisional]~~ license to practice funeral directing to an applicant  
3 who:

- 4 (1) is at least 18 years of age;
- 5 (2) has completed the educational requirements of  
6 Section 651.253;
- 7 (3) passes ~~[takes]~~ the written examination given by  
8 the commission;
- 9 (4) files an application for a trainee ~~[provisional]~~  
10 license on a form provided by the commission and verified under oath  
11 by the applicant; and
- 12 (5) pays any required application or license fee.

13 (b) The commission shall issue a trainee ~~[provisional]~~  
14 license to practice embalming to an applicant who:

- 15 (1) is at least 18 years of age;
- 16 (2) has completed the educational requirements of  
17 Section 651.253;
- 18 (3) passes ~~[takes]~~ the written examination given by  
19 the commission;
- 20 (4) files an application for a trainee ~~[provisional]~~  
21 license;
- 22 (5) pays any required application or license fee; and
- 23 (6) complies with the requirements of this chapter and  
24 of the commission.

25 (c) An applicant who does not obtain a trainee ~~[provisional]~~  
26 license before the second anniversary of the date the applicant  
27 takes the examination must pass the examination again before being

1 licensed as a trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder.

2           Sec. 651.303. TRAINEE [~~PROVISIONAL~~] LICENSE PROGRAM. (a)  
3 The commission shall prescribe and supervise the course of  
4 instruction received by a trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder  
5 while participating in a trainee [~~provisional~~] license program.

6           (b) The commission by rule shall define the terms of  
7 employment of a trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder. The terms of  
8 employment must include service by the trainee [~~provisional~~]  
9 license holder under actual working conditions and under the  
10 personal supervision of a funeral director or embalmer.

11           (c) The term of the trainee [~~provisional~~] license program  
12 must be at least 12 consecutive months.

13           (d) The trainee [~~provisional~~] license program must include  
14 assisting with at least 60 cases. Not more than two trainee  
15 [~~provisional~~] license holders may receive credit for work done on  
16 any one body. The commission by rule shall:

17                   (1) define the standards for a case;

18                   (2) set the number of cases a trainee [~~provisional~~]  
19 license holder is required to complete during the program; and

20                   (3) establish guidelines for supervision under which a  
21 trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder is granted increased  
22 responsibilities during the course of the trainee [~~provisional~~]  
23 license program.

24           (e) The standards required for a complete case include:

25                   (1) for an embalmer, all the duties and activities  
26 necessary for embalming; and

27                   (2) for a funeral director, all the activities

1 necessary from the time the body is obtained until final  
2 disposition.

3 (f) The funeral director trainee [~~provisional~~] license  
4 program may be served concurrently with the embalmer trainee  
5 [~~provisional~~] license program.

6 Sec. 651.304. EMPLOYMENT REPORTS. (a) On entering  
7 employment with a funeral director or embalmer, a trainee  
8 [~~provisional~~] license holder shall immediately notify the  
9 commission of the name and place of business of the funeral director  
10 or embalmer under whom the trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder  
11 will train. The funeral director or embalmer shall sign the  
12 notification.

13 (b) A trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder shall report to  
14 the commission monthly. The report must:

15 (1) be made not later than the 10th day after the end  
16 of the month;

17 (2) identify each case that the trainee [~~provisional~~]  
18 license holder:

19 (A) assisted in handling during that month if the  
20 trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder is a funeral director  
21 applicant; or

22 (B) handled or assisted in handling during that  
23 month if the trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder is an embalmer  
24 applicant; and

25 (3) be certified by the funeral director or embalmer  
26 under whom the trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder performed the  
27 work.



1 (c) The trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder shall make the  
2 monthly report required by Subsection (b) regardless of whether the  
3 trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder performed an activity  
4 described by Subsection (b) during that month for which a report is  
5 required.

6 (d) If a trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder leaves the  
7 employment of a funeral director or embalmer, the funeral director  
8 or embalmer shall prepare an affidavit showing the length of time  
9 the trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder was employed and the  
10 number of cases handled while employed by the funeral director or  
11 embalmer. The original affidavit shall be filed with the commission  
12 and made a matter of record. A copy of the affidavit shall be  
13 furnished to the trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder.

14 (e) The commission shall furnish report forms to be used by  
15 a trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder.

16 Sec. 651.305. RENEWAL OR REINSTATEMENT OF TRAINEE  
17 [~~PROVISIONAL~~] LICENSE.

18 (c) If a trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder fails to  
19 timely pay the renewal fee, the commission shall:

20 (1) impose a late payment penalty equal to the amount  
21 of the license renewal fee;

22 (2) suspend the license for nonpayment; and

23 (3) notify the trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder of  
24 the suspension.

25 (d) If the renewal fee and penalty are not paid before the  
26 91st day after the date of the notice of suspension, the commission  
27 shall cancel the license. If the license is canceled under this

1 subsection, the trainee [~~provisional~~] license holder may apply for  
2 reinstatement not later than 18 months after the date of  
3 cancellation. The commission may reinstate the canceled license if:

4 (1) all other commission requirements are satisfied;  
5 and

6 (2) the license fee and a late payment penalty equal to  
7 the amount of the license fee for the period of the cancellation are  
8 paid.

9 (e) A trainee [~~provisional~~] license may be renewed after the  
10 second anniversary of the date of its issuance only if the person  
11 requests and receives from the commission an extension based on  
12 hardship.

13 (f) A trainee [~~provisional~~] license that has been canceled  
14 or suspended or has lapsed for a period of at least five years may be  
15 reinstated only if the applicant passes the written embalming or  
16 funeral directing examination.

17 (g) The commission may adopt rules relating to the  
18 reinstatement of a trainee [~~provisional~~] license under this  
19 section.

20 SECTION 17. Section 651.401(b), Occupations Code, is  
21 amended to read as follows:

22 (b) A dead human body may be transferred without a funeral  
23 director personally making the transfer:

24 (1) from one funeral establishment to another;

25 (2) from the place of death or a funeral establishment  
26 to [~~and from~~] a morgue in which an autopsy is performed and from the  
27 morgue to a funeral establishment;

1           (3) to and from an airport, crematory, or both; or  
2           (4) in circumstances in which there is no reasonable  
3 probability that an unlicensed person will encounter a family  
4 member or other person with whom funeral arrangements are normally  
5 made by a funeral director or embalmer.

6           SECTION 18. Section 651.404, Occupations Code, is amended  
7 to read as follows:

8           Sec. 651.404. CONSUMER BROCHURE. When funeral services are  
9 discussed, a funeral director or agent of the funeral establishment  
10 shall provide each prospective customer with a copy of the brochure  
11 prepared by the commission under Section 651.201. The funeral  
12 establishment may [~~shall~~] print additional copies of the brochure  
13 only if the commission is unable to provide the number of brochures  
14 needed by the funeral establishment.

15           SECTION 19. Section 651.405, Occupations Code, is amended  
16 by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

17           (c) A funeral establishment must provide a copy of the  
18 retail price list to a prospective customer before discussing:

19                   (1) the prices of goods or services;  
20                   (2) the types of funeral services or final  
21 dispositions offered; or

22                   (3) the funeral merchandise offered by the funeral  
23 establishment.

24           SECTION 20. Section 651.4055, Occupations Code, is amended  
25 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

26           (d) A cemetery or crematory business must provide a copy of  
27 the retail price list to a prospective customer before discussing:

- 1           (1) the prices of goods or services;  
2           (2) the types of services or final dispositions  
3 offered; or  
4           (3) the goods or services offered by the crematory or  
5 cemetery business.

6           SECTION 21. Section 651.406(c), Occupations Code, is  
7 amended to read as follows:

8           (c) The purchase agreement must include the original  
9 signature of [~~shall be signed by~~] the funeral director making the  
10 arrangements.

11           SECTION 22. Section 651.451, Occupations Code, is amended
