- 2 relating to the structure, powers, and duties of the State Board of

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 7, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 7.0021 to read as follows: 7
- Sec. 7.0021. STRUCTURE OF ADMINISTRATION. The board has 8
- 9 primary responsibility for adopting educational policies and
- administering and directing public education in this state. The 10
- 11 commissioner is the executive officer with responsibility for
- 12 carrying out the board's policies and directions. The board may
- overturn a decision of the commissioner or of the agency as the 13
- board determines necessary. 14
- SECTION 2. Section 7.055(a), Education Code, is amended to 15
- 16 read as follows:
- Subject to oversight by the board, the 17 [The]
- commissioner has the powers and duties provided by Subsection (b). 18
- SECTION 3. Section 7.102(b), Education Code, is amended to 19
- read as follows: 20
- 21 The board has the powers and duties <u>necessary to</u>
- administer and direct public education in this state, including the 22
- 23 powers and duties provided by Subsection (c). The board shall carry
- [r which shall be carried] out its powers and duties with the advice 24

- 1 and assistance of the commissioner.
- 2 SECTION 4. Section 7.102(c), Education Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subdivision (35) to read as follows:
- 4 (35) The board may employ a reasonable number of staff
- 5 in carrying out its powers and duties under this section.
- 6 SECTION 5. Sections 7.104(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) At each general election immediately following a
- 9 decennial reapportionment of congressional districts, one member
- 10 shall be elected to the board from each congressional district.
- 11 Except as provided by Subsection (b), members of the board serve
- 12 staggered terms of four years with the terms of one-half of the
- 13 [eight] members, or as near to one-half as possible, expiring on
- 14 January 1 of one odd-numbered year and the terms of one-half of the
- 15 [seven] members, or as near to one-half as possible, expiring on
- 16 January 1 of the next odd-numbered year.
- 17 (b) One-half of the [Seven] members of the board elected at
- 18 each general election following a decennial reapportionment of
- 19 <u>congressional</u> districts, or as near to one-half as possible, shall
- serve two-year terms and <u>one-half of the</u> [eight] members, or as near
- 21 <u>to one-half as possible</u>, shall serve four-year terms. Members shall
- draw lots to determine who serves which terms.
- SECTION 6. Section 7.106, Education Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- Sec. 7.106. MEETINGS. The board shall hold four meetings a
- year in Austin, Texas, on dates determined by the presiding officer
- 27 [chair] and may hold other meetings as may be called by the

- presiding officer [chair].
- 2 SECTION 7. Sections 7.107(b) and (c), Education Code, are
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (b) At the board's first regular meeting after the election
- 5 and qualification of new members, the board shall organize, adopt
- 6 rules of procedure, and elect by separate votes a presiding
- 7 officer, an assistant presiding officer, [vice chair] and a
- 8 secretary.
- 9 (c) A person who serves two consecutive terms as presiding
- 10 <u>officer</u> [chair] is ineligible to again serve as <u>presiding officer</u>
- 11 [chair] until four years have elapsed since the expiration of the
- 12 second term.
- 13 SECTION 8. Sections 7.051, 7.052, 7.053, 7.101(a), and
- 7.107(a), Education Code, are repealed.
- SECTION 9. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this Act,
- this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 17 (b) Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10 of this Act take effect
- December 5, 2003, but only if the constitutional amendment proposed
- 19 by the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, relating to the
- 20 structure, powers, and duties of the State Board of Education, is
- 21 approved by the voters. If that amendment is not approved by the
- voters, Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10 of this Act have no effect.
- SECTION 10. (a) Members of the State Board of Education
- 24 elected under Section 7.101, Education Code, or appointed under
- 25 Section 7.104, Education Code, as those sections existed before
- 26 amendment by this Act, continue to serve until their successors are
- 27 elected and qualify for office. The successors shall be elected at

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- 1 the general election in 2004 for state and county officers. The
- 2 presiding officer of the newly elected board shall call the first
- 3 meeting as soon as possible after a quorum of the newly elected
- 4 board members have qualified for office.
- 5 (b) Of the members of the first board elected under this
- 6 Act, 15 members serve two-year terms and 15 members serve four-year
- 7 terms. The members shall draw lots to determine the length of their
- 8 terms.
- 9 (c) Rules of the State Board of Education that are in effect
- 10 on the date of the first meeting of the State Board of Education
- 11 elected under this Act remain in effect until superseded by rules
- 12 adopted by the State Board of Education elected under this Act.
