5 SECTION 1. Section 411.122, Government Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read 7 as follows:

8 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c)(2), an agency of 9 this state <u>listed in Subsection (d)</u> or a political subdivision of 10 this state covered by Chapter 53, Occupations Code, that licenses 11 or regulates members of a particular trade, occupation, business, 12 vocation, or profession is entitled to obtain from the department 13 criminal history record information maintained by the department 14 that relates to a person who [<del>is</del>]:

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(1) <u>is</u> an applicant for a license from the agency; [<del>or</del>]

(2) is the holder of a license from the agency; or

17 (3) requests a determination of eligibility for a
18 license from the agency.

(c) This section does not apply to an agency that is:(1) specifically authorized by this subchapter to

obtain criminal history record information from the department; or
(2) covered by Section 53.002, Occupations Code<u>, to</u>
the extent provided by that section.
