A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to continuation and functions of the State Board for
- 3 Educator Certification.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.031(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (b) In <u>adopting</u> [proposing] rules under this subchapter,
- 8 the board shall ensure that all candidates for certification or
- 9 renewal of certification demonstrate the knowledge and skills
- 10 necessary to improve the performance of the diverse student
- 11 population of this state.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 21.033(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 (a) The State Board for Educator Certification is composed
- 15 of 15 members. The commissioner of education shall appoint an
- 16 employee of the agency to represent the commissioner as a nonvoting
- 17 member. The commissioner of higher education shall appoint an
- 18 employee of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to
- 19 represent the commissioner as a nonvoting member. The governor
- 20 shall appoint a dean of a college of education in this state as a
- 21 nonvoting member. The State Board of Education shall appoint two
- 22 members, who may be appointed from among the membership of the State
- 23 Board of Education. The remaining 10 = 10 members are appointed by
- 24 the governor with the advice and consent of the senate, as follows:

- 1 (1) $\underline{\text{three}}$ [four] members must be teachers employed in 2 public schools;
- 3 (2) two members must be public school administrators;
- 4 (3) one member must be a public school counselor; and
- (4) <u>four</u> [<u>five</u>] members must be citizens, three of whom are not and have not, in the five years preceding appointment, been employed by a public school district or by an educator preparation program in an institution of higher education and two of whom are not and have not been employed by a public school
- 10 district or by an educator preparation program in an institution of
- 11 higher education.
- SECTION 3. Sections 21.034(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The board members appointed by the <u>State Board of</u>
 15 <u>Education and the</u> governor hold office for staggered terms of six
 16 years with the terms of one-third of the members expiring on
 17 February 1 of each odd-numbered year. A member appointed by the
 18 commissioner of education or the commissioner of higher education
- 19 serves at the will of the appointing commissioner.
- 20 (b) In the event of a vacancy during a term of a member
- 21 appointed by the <u>State Board of Education or the</u> governor, the <u>State</u>
- 22 Board of Education or the governor, as appropriate, shall appoint a
- 23 replacement who meets the qualifications of the vacated office to
- 24 fill the unexpired portion of the term.
- 25 SECTION 4. Section 21.035, Education Code, is amended to
- 26 read as follows:
- Sec. 21.035. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The board is

- 1 subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless
- 2 continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the board is
- 3 abolished and this subchapter expires September 1, 2015 [2003].
- 4 SECTION 5. Sections 21.041(b) and (c), Education Code, are
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) The board shall <u>adopt</u> [propose] rules that:
- 7 (1) provide for the regulation of educators and the
- 8 general administration of this subchapter in a manner consistent
- 9 with this subchapter;
- 10 (2) specify the classes of educator certificates to be
- 11 issued, including emergency certificates;
- 12 (3) specify the period for which each class of
- 13 educator certificate is valid;
- 14 (4) specify the requirements for the issuance and
- 15 renewal of an educator certificate;
- 16 (5) provide for the issuance of an educator
- 17 certificate to a person who holds a similar certificate issued by
- another state or foreign country, subject to Section 21.052;
- 19 (6) provide for special or restricted certification of
- 20 educators, including certification of instructors of American Sign
- 21 Language;
- 22 (7) provide for the investigation of complaints of
- 23 <u>disciplinary violations, including:</u>
- (A) a deadline for each action in the
- 25 investigation of a complaint;
- 26 (B) notification requirements for each party
- involved in the complaint; and

- 1 (C) a method for designating the severity of an
- 2 alleged violation that allows the board to set priorities for
- 3 conducting investigations;
- 4 (8) provide for disciplinary proceedings, including
- 5 the suspension or revocation of an educator certificate, as
- 6 provided by Chapter 2001, Government Code;
- 7 $\underline{(9)}$ [\(\frac{(8)}{}\)] provide for the adoption, amendment, and
- 8 enforcement of an educator's code of ethics;
- 9 $\underline{(10)}$ [$\underline{(9)}$] provide for continuing education
- 10 requirements; and
- 11 (11) $[\frac{(10)}{}]$ provide for certification of persons
- 12 performing appraisals under Subchapter H.
- (c) The board shall by rule adopt [propose a rule adopting]
- 14 a fee for the issuance and maintenance of an educator certificate
- 15 that is adequate to cover the cost of administration of this
- 16 subchapter.
- 17 SECTION 6. Section 21.044, Education Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 21.044. EDUCATOR PREPARATION. The board shall adopt
- 20 [propose] rules establishing the training requirements a person
- 21 must accomplish to obtain a certificate, enter an internship, or
- 22 enter an induction-year program. The board shall specify the
- 23 minimum academic qualifications required for a certificate.
- SECTION 7. Sections 21.045(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) The board shall adopt [propose] rules establishing
- 27 standards to govern the approval and continuing accountability of

- 1 all educator preparation programs based on information that is
- 2 disaggregated with respect to sex and ethnicity and that includes:
- 3 (1) results of the certification examinations
- 4 prescribed under Section 21.048(a); and
- 5 (2) performance based on the appraisal system for
- 6 beginning teachers adopted by the board.
- 7 (c) The board shall <u>adopt</u> [propose] rules establishing
- 8 performance standards for the Accountability System for Educator
- 9 Preparation for accrediting educator preparation programs. At a
- 10 minimum, performance standards must be based on Subsection (a).
- 11 The board shall <u>adopt</u> [propose] rules for the sanction of educator
- 12 preparation programs and shall annually review the accreditation
- 13 status of each educator preparation program.
- SECTION 8. Section 21.048(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (a) The board shall adopt [propose] rules prescribing
- 17 comprehensive examinations for each class of certificate issued by
- 18 the board.
- 19 SECTION 9. Section 21.049(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (a) To provide a continuing additional source of qualified
- 22 educators, the board shall adopt [propose] rules providing for
- 23 educator certification programs as an alternative to traditional
- 24 educator preparation programs. The rules may not provide that a
- 25 person may be certified under this section only if there is a
- 26 demonstrated shortage of educators in a school district or subject
- 27 area.

- 1 SECTION 10. Section 21.050(b), Education Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (b) The board may not require more than 18 semester credit
- 4 hours of education courses at the baccalaureate level for the
- 5 granting of a teaching certificate. The board shall provide for a
- 6 minimum number of semester credit hours of internship to be
- 7 included in the hours needed for certification. The board may adopt
- 8 [propose] rules requiring additional credit hours for
- 9 certification in bilingual education, English as a second language,
- 10 early childhood education, or special education.
- 11 SECTION 11. Section 21.051, Education Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 21.051. OPTIONS FOR FIELD EXPERIENCE AND INTERNSHIPS.
- 14 The board shall adopt [propose] rules providing flexible options
- 15 for persons for any field experience or internship required for
- 16 certification.
- 17 SECTION 12. Section 21.054(a), Education Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (a) The board shall <u>adopt</u> [propose] rules establishing a
- 20 process for identifying continuing education courses and programs
- 21 that fulfill educators' continuing education requirements.
- 22 SECTION 13. Section 21.055, Education Code, is amended by
- 23 amending Subsections (c) and (d) and adding Subsection (c-1) to
- 24 read as follows:
- 25 (c) Promptly after employing a person under this section, a
- 26 school district shall send to the board and the commissioner a
- 27 written statement identifying the person, the person's

- 1 qualifications as a teacher, and the subject or class the person
- 2 will teach. The person may teach the subject or class pending
- 3 action by the commissioner.
- 4 (c-1) Promptly after receiving a statement under Subsection
- 5 (c), the board shall request criminal history record information
- 6 under Section 411.090, Government Code, that relates to the person.
- 7 Not later than the 5th day after the date the board receives the
- 8 criminal history record information, the board shall provide the
- 9 information to the commissioner and the district employing the
- 10 person.
- (d) Not later than the 45th [30th] day after the date the
- 12 commissioner receives the statement under Subsection (c), the
- 13 commissioner may inform the district in writing that the
- 14 commissioner finds the person is not qualified to teach. The person
- may not teach if the commissioner finds the person is not qualified.
- 16 If the commissioner fails to act within the time prescribed by this
- 17 subsection, the district may issue to the person a school district
- 18 teaching permit and the person may teach the subject or class
- 19 identified in the statement.
- SECTION 14. Section 21.057(d), Education Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 (d) For purposes of this section, "inappropriately
- 23 certified or uncertified teacher":
- 24 (1) includes:
- 25 (A) an individual serving on an emergency
- certificate issued under Section 21.041(b)(2); or
- 27 (B) an individual who does not hold any

- 1 certificate or permit issued under this chapter and is not employed
- 2 as specified by Subdivision (2)(E); and
- 4 (A) who is a certified teacher assigned to teach
- 5 a class or classes outside his or her area of certification, as
- 6 determined by rules adopted [proposed] by the board in specifying
- 7 the certificate required for each assignment;
- 8 (B) serving on a certificate issued due to a
- 9 hearing impairment under Section 21.048;
- 10 (C) serving on a certificate issued pursuant to
- 11 enrollment in an approved alternative certification program under
- 12 Section 21.049;
- 13 (D) certified by another state or country and
- 14 serving on a certificate issued under Section 21.052;
- 15 (E) serving on a school district teaching permit
- 16 issued under Section 21.055; or
- 17 (F) employed under a waiver granted by the
- 18 commissioner pursuant to Section 7.056.
- 19 SECTION 15. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 21.058 to read as follows:
- 21 Sec. 21.058. COMPLAINTS. (a) The board shall maintain a
- file on each written complaint filed with the board.
- 23 (b) The file must include:
- 24 (1) the name of the person who filed the complaint;
- 25 (2) the date the complaint is received by the board;
- 26 (3) the subject matter of the complaint;
- 27 (4) the name of each person contacted in relation to

- 1 the complaint;
- 2 (5) a summary of the results of the review or
- 3 investigation of the complaint; and
- 4 (6) an explanation of the reason the file was closed,
- 5 if the board closed the file without taking action other than to
- 6 investigate the complaint.
- 7 <u>(c) The board shall provide to the person filing the</u>
- 8 complaint and to each person who is a subject of the complaint a
- 9 copy of the board's policies and procedures relating to complaint
- 10 investigation and resolution.
- 11 (d) The board, at least quarterly until final disposition of
- 12 the complaint, shall notify the person filing the complaint and
- each person who is a subject of the complaint of the status of the
- 14 investigation unless the notice would jeopardize an undercover
- 15 <u>investigation</u>.
- SECTION 16. Section 21.553(c), Education Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (c) The State Board for Educator Certification shall adopt
- 19 [propose] rules establishing criteria for awarding financial
- 20 incentives under this section, including criteria for awarding
- 21 financial incentives if there are more participants than funds
- 22 available to provide the financial incentives.
- SECTION 17. Section 22.082, Education Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- Sec. 22.082. ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS BY STATE
- 26 BOARD FOR EDUCATOR CERTIFICATION. The State Board for Educator
- 27 Certification shall obtain from any law enforcement or criminal

- 1 justice agency all <u>state and national</u> criminal history record
- 2 information that relates to an applicant for or holder of a
- 3 certificate or permit issued under Subchapter B, Chapter 21,
- 4 including a teaching permit issued by a school district. The board
- 5 shall require an applicant to pay any costs related to obtaining
- 6 criminal history information under this section.
- 7 SECTION 18. Section 411.090(a), Government Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The State Board for Educator Certification is entitled
- 10 to obtain from the department any criminal history record
- 11 information maintained by the department about a person who has
- 12 applied to the board for a certificate or permit under Subchapter B,
- 13 Chapter 21, Education Code.
- 14 SECTION 19. Section 21.042, Education Code, is repealed.
- 15 SECTION 20. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- 16 this section, the State Board of Education shall make its initial
- 17 appointments to the State Board for Educator Certification by
- appointing persons to replace the members appointed by the governor
- 19 under Sections 21.033(a)(1) and (4), Education Code, as that
- 20 section existed before amendment by this Act, whose terms expire
- 21 February 1, 2005.
- 22 (b) Notwithstanding Section 21.034(b), Education Code, as
- 23 amended by this Act, if a vacancy occurs before February 1, 2005, on
- 24 the State Board for Educator Certification in a position described
- 25 by Subsection (a) of this section, the State Board of Education
- 26 shall appoint a person as provided by Section 21.033(a), Education
- 27 Code, as amended by this Act, to serve the remainder of the term of

- 1 the vacated position.
- 2 SECTION 21. Section 21.058, Education Code, as added by
- 3 this Act, applies only to a complaint filed with the State Board for
- 4 Educator Certification on or after September 1, 2003, regardless of
- 5 whether the conduct or act that is the subject of the complaint
- 6 occurred or was committed before, on, or after that date.
- 7 SECTION 22. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
