12	(b) Subsection (a) does not apply to:

17	(2) the use of an internal mail system by a state
18	agency or municipality to distribute political advertising that is
19	the subject of or related to an investigation, hearing, or other
20	official proceeding of the agency or municipality.
21	(c) A person who violates this section commits an offense.
22	An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
23	(d) In this section:
24	(1) "Internal mail system" means a system operated by

1	a state agency or political subdivision to deliver written
2	documents to officers or employees of the agency or subdivision.
3	(2) "State agency" means:
4	(A) a department, commission, board, office, or
5	other agency that is in the legislative, executive, or judicial
6	branch of state government;
7	(B) a university system or an institution of
8	higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code; or
9	(C) a river authority created under the
10	constitution or a statute of this state.
11	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
