## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a county court at law in Rockwall
3	County.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 25, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 25.2011 and 25.2012 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 25.2011. ROCKWALL COUNTY. Rockwall County has one
8	statutory county court, the County Court at Law of Rockwall County.
9	Sec. 25.2012. ROCKWALL COUNTY COURT AT LAW PROVISIONS. (a)
10	In addition to the jurisdiction provided by Section 25.0003 and
11	other law, and except as limited by Subsection (b), a county court
12	at law in Rockwall County has, concurrent with the district court,
13	the jurisdiction provided by the constitution and general law for
14	district courts.
15	(b) A county court at law does not have general supervisory
16	control or appellate review of the commissioners court or
17	jurisdiction of:
18	(1) felony cases involving capital murder;
19	(2) suits on behalf of the state to recover penalties
20	or escheated property;
21	(3) misdemeanors involving official misconduct; or
22	(4) contested elections.
23	(c) The district clerk serves as clerk of a county court at
24	law except that the county clerk serves as clerk of the county court

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- 1 at law in matters of mental health, the probate and criminal
- 2 misdemeanor docket, and all civil matters in which the county court
- 3 at law does not have concurrent jurisdiction with the district
- 4 court.
- 5 (d) Jurors regularly impaneled for the week by the district
- 6 courts may, at the request of the judge of a county court at law, be
- 7 made available by the district judge in the numbers requested and
- 8 shall serve for the week or until released in the county court at
- 9 law.
- 10 (e) A county court at law may summon jurors through the
- 11 county clerk for service in the county court at law in the manner
- 12 provided by the laws governing the drawing, selection, and service
- of jurors for county courts. Jurors summoned shall be paid in the
- 14 same manner and at the same rate as jurors for district courts in
- 15 Rockwall County. By order of the judge of a county court at law,
- jurors summoned to the county court at law may be transferred to the
- 17 district court for service in noncapital felony cases.
- (f) Notwithstanding Sections 74.091 and 74.0911, a district
- 19 judge serves as the local administrative judge for the district and
- 20 statutory county courts in Rockwall County. The judges of district
- 21 courts shall elect a district judge as local administrative judge
- 22 for a term of not more than two years. The local administrative
- 23 judge may not be elected on the basis of rotation or seniority.
- 24 (g) When administering a case for the county court at law,
- 25 the district clerk shall charge civil fees and court costs as if the
- 26 <u>case had been filed in the district court. In a case of concurrent</u>
- 27 jurisdiction, the case shall be assigned to either the district

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- 1 court or the county court at law in accordance with local
- 2 administrative rules established by the local administrative
- 3 judge.
- 4 (h) The judge of the county court at law shall appoint an
- 5 official court reporter for the court and shall set the official
- 6 court reporter's annual salary, subject to approval by the county
- 7 commissioners court. The official court reporter of the county
- 8 court at law shall take an oath or affirmation as an officer of the
- 9 court. The official court reporter holds office at the pleasure of
- 10 the judge of the court and shall be provided a private office in
- 11 close proximity to the court. The official court reporter is
- 12 entitled to all rights and benefits afforded all other county
- 13 employees.
- (i) With the approval of the county commissioners court and
- through the county budget process, the judge of the county court at
- 16 law shall hire a staff. The staff of the judge of the county court
- 17 at law consists of a court coordinator and a bailiff. Court
- 18 personnel employed under this subsection are entitled to receive a
- 19 salary set by the commissioners court and other employment benefits
- 20 received by county employees.
- 21 (j) Not later than one year after the date of appointment,
- the bailiff of a county court at law must obtain a peace officer
- 23 license under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, from the Commission
- on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education. The sheriff of
- 25 Rockwall County shall deputize the bailiff of a county court at law.
- 26 The bailiff of a county court at law is subject to the training and
- 27 continuing education requirements of a sheriff's deputy of the

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- 1 county. The sheriff shall remove from office a bailiff who does not
- 2 receive a peace officer license within one year of appointment as
- 3 <u>required by this subsection.</u>
- 4 (k) The judge of a county court at law must be a United
- 5 States citizen at the time of appointment or election.
- 6 (1) The judge of a county court at law shall diligently
- 7 <u>discharge the duties of the office on a full-time basis and may not</u>
- 8 engage in the private practice of law.
- 9 <u>(m) In matters of concurrent jurisdiction, the</u> judge of a
- 10 county court at law and the district judge may exchange benches,
- 11 transfer cases subject to acceptance, assign each other to hear
- 12 cases, and otherwise manage their respective dockets under local
- 13 administrative rules.
- 14 (n) The judge of a county court at law has the same judicial
- 15 <u>immunity as a district judge</u>.
- 16 SECTION 2. The County Court at Law of Rockwall County is
- 17 created and this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
