4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 534.053, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	Sec. 534.053. REQUIRED COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES. (a) <u>In</u>
8	this section, "therapeutic foster care" means 24-hour living
9	arrangements with trained foster parents for a child who is
10	temporarily unable to live with the child's parent or other primary
11	caregiver, and specialized treatment and services that may include
12	training for the parent or other primary caregiver, training and
13	support for foster parents, crisis management services, and
14	individual, group, and family counseling.
15	(b) The department shall ensure that, at a minimum, the
16	following services are available in each service area:
17	(1) 24-hour emergency screening and rapid crisis
18	stabilization services;
19	(2) community-based crisis residential services or
20	hospitalization;
21	(3) community-based assessments, including the
22	development of interdisciplinary treatment plans and diagnosis and
23	evaluation services;
24	(4) family support services, including respite care;

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(5) case management services;

2 (6) medication-related services, including medication
3 clinics, laboratory monitoring, medication education, mental
4 health maintenance education, and the provision of medication;
5 [and]

6 (7) psychosocial rehabilitation programs, including 7 social support activities, independent living skills, and 8 vocational training; and

9 (8) therapeutic foster care for a child for whom the 10 parent-child relationship has not been terminated.

11 (c) [(b)] The department shall arrange for appropriate 12 community-based services, including the assignment of a case 13 manager, to be available in each service area for each person 14 discharged from a department facility who is in need of care.

15 (d) [(c)] To the extent that resources are available, the 16 department shall:

(1) ensure that the services listed in this section are available for children, including adolescents, <u>and</u> [<del>as well as</del>] adults[<del>,</del>] in each service area;

20 (2) emphasize early intervention services for 21 children, including adolescents, who meet the department's 22 definition of being at high risk of developing severe emotional 23 disturbances or severe mental illnesses; and

(3) ensure that services listed in this section are
available for defendants required to submit to mental health
treatment under Article 17.032 or Section 5(a) or 11(d), Article
42.12, Code of Criminal Procedure.
