18	(D) unauthorized disclosure, use, and
19	dissemination of personal identification information regarding

21	(2) "Obscene" has the meaning assigned by Section

23	Sec. 32.152. LIMITATION ON CERTAIN FUNDS. A public school

(a) In this 6 section: 7 (1) "Internet safety policy" means a policy that 8 addresses: 9 (A) measures designed to restrict access by 10 minors to obscene material on the Internet; (B) the safety and security of minors when using 11 electronic mail, chat rooms, and other forms of direct electronic 12 13 communications; 14 (C) unauthorized access and other unlawful 15 activities by minors on-line; and (D) unauthorized disclosure, use, and 16 17 dissemination of personal identification information regarding minors. 18 (2) "Obscene" has the meaning assigned by Section 19 43.21, Penal Code. 20 21 (b) A public library that provides a computer with Internet access to the public is not eligible for a loan or grant under 22 Subchapter C, Chapter 57, Utilities Code, unless the public library 23 24 adopts and implements an Internet safety policy. 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
