EXCEPTION: CERTAIN ADDRESSES, 8 TELEPHONE NUMBERS, SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS, AND PERSONAL FAMILY INFORMATION. 9 Information is excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021 if 10 11 it is information that relates to the home address, home telephone 12 number, or social security number of the following person or that reveals whether the person has family members: 13 14 (1) a current or former official or employee of a governmental body, except as otherwise provided by Section 552.024; 15 (2) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code of 16 Criminal Procedure, or a security officer commissioned under 17 18 Section 51.212, Education Code, regardless of whether the officer complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable; 19 <u>a current or former [an]</u> employee of the Texas (3) 20 21 Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of 22 the department or any division of the department, regardless of 23 whether the current or former employee complies with Section 24 552.1175;

SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act to Sections 552.117 and 552.1175, Government Code, applies to information about former employees of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of the department or any of the department's divisions without regard to whether the information was created or acquired on, before, or after the effective date of

2 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
