- 7 (6) "Volunteer fire department" means a fire 8 department operated by its members, including a partially paid fire 9 department, that:
- 10 (A) is operated on a not-for-profit basis, 11 including a department exempt from federal income tax under Section 12 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, by being listed as an exempt 13 organization in Section 501(c)(3) of that code; and
- 14 (B) participates in a firefighter certification 15 program administered:
- 16 (i) under Section 419.071; [ex]
- 17 (ii) by the State Firemen's and Fire
- 18 Marshals' Association of Texas; or
- 19 (iii) by the National Wildfire Coordinating
- 20 Group.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 614.073, Government Code, as added by
- 22 Chapter 1363, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001,
- 23 is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 614.073. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The director shall

- 1 appoint an advisory committee to advise the director in regard to
- 2 the administration of the program.
- 3 (b) The advisory committee consists of five members with [as
- 4 follows:
- 5 [(1) two members of the Texas Rural Fire Advisory
- 6 Council;
- 7 [(2) two elected county officials; and
- 8 [(3) one elected representative of a municipality with
- 9 a population of 10,000 or less.
- 10 [(c) The director shall appoint] one [advisory committee]
- 11 member appointed from each of the following geographic regions of
- 12 the state: north, south, east, west, and central.
- 13 (c) A member of the advisory committee is entitled to
- 14 reimbursement of reasonable travel expenses incurred by the member
- in performing duties as a member of the advisory committee, subject
- to any applicable limitation on reimbursement provided by general
- 17 law or the General Appropriations Act. A member may not receive
- 18 compensation for services.
