8	SECONDARY EDUCATION. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
10	assigned by Section 61.003.
11	(2) "Nontraditional secondary education" means a
12	course of study at the secondary school level in a nonaccredited
13	private school setting, including a home school.
14	(b) Because the State of Texas considers successful
15	completion of a nontraditional secondary education to be equivalent
16	to graduation from a public high school, an institution of higher
17	education must treat an applicant for admission to the institution
18	as an undergraduate student who presents evidence that the person
19	has successfully completed a nontraditional secondary education
20	according to the same general standards as other applicants for
21	undergraduate admission who have graduated from a public high
22	school.
23	(c) An institution of higher education may not require an
24	applicant for admission to the institution as an undergraduate

1	student who presents evidence that the person has successfully
2	completed a nontraditional secondary education to:
3	(1) obtain or submit evidence that the person has
4	obtained a general education development certificate, certificate
5	of high school equivalency, or other credentials equivalent to a
6	public high school degree; or
7	(2) take an examination or comply with any other
8	application or admission requirement not generally applicable to
9	other applicants for undergraduate admission to the institution.
10	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
11	applies only to undergraduate admissions to an institution of
12	higher education for a term or semester that begins on or after that
13	date. Undergraduate admissions for a term or semester that begins
14	before the effective date are covered by the law in effect
15	immediately before that date, and the former law is continued in
16	effect for that purpose.
