A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the penalty for speeding on a highway where the Texas 3 Transportation Commission has established a speed limit for environmental purposes. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 542, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 542.405 to read as follows: 7 8 Sec. 542.405. FINE FOR SPEEDING OFFENSE IN ENVIRONMENTAL SPEED ZONE. (a) If a person commits an offense under Section 9 545.351 on a part of the highway system where the Texas 10 Transportation Commission has declared a prima facie speed limit 11 12 for environmental purposes and the person was exceeding that speed limit by 20 miles per hour or less, the maximum fine applicable to 13 the off<u>ense is \$25.</u> 14 (b) A person who delivers or issues for delivery insurance 15 coverage for a motor vehicle may not consider an offense described 16 by Subsection (a) in determining the rate for the coverage. A 17 18 person that violates this subsection is subject to the penalties described by Article 5.12-1, Insurance Code. 19 SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 545, Transportation Code, 20 21 is amended by adding Section 545.3531 to read as follows: 22 Sec. 545.3531. SPEED LIMIT DECLARED FOR ENVIRONMENTAL 23 PURPOSES. If the Texas Transportation Commission declares on a highway a prima facie speed limit for environmental purposes, the 24

1	commission shall inform the appropriate law enforcement agencies
2	and courts of the declared speed limit and where the declared speed
3	limit begins and ends on that highway.
4	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
5	applies only to an offense committed on or after that date. An
6	offense committed before the effective date of this Act is covered
7	by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the
8	former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
