## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to prohibiting a governmental body from disclosing a

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code, is
- amended by adding Section 552.140 to read as follows: 7
- Sec. 552.140. PROHIBITION ON DISCLOSURE OF SOCIAL SECURITY 8
- NUMBER. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a person's social 9
- security number may not be disclosed to a member of the public by a 10
- 11 governmental body in response to a request for the information made
- 12 under this chapter or another law of this state without the person's
- written consent. The consent must be given on a clear and 13
- 14 understandable form that the attorney general shall prescribe for
- that purpose. If the consent form is part of a larger document the 15
- 16 consent form must be a separate page of the larger document and the
- person's signature must appear on that page. 17
- 18 (b) Subsection (a) does not prohibit the disclosure of a
- person's social security number without the person's consent to a 19
- federal, state, or local governmental entity for a legitimate 20
- 21 governmental purpose.
- SECTION 2. Section 552.024(a), Government Code, is amended 22
- 23 to read as follows:
- (a) Each employee or official of a governmental body and 24

- 1 each former employee or official of a governmental body shall
- 2 choose whether to allow public access to the information in the
- 3 custody of the governmental body that relates to the person's home
- 4 address or [7] home telephone number [7 or social security number,]
- or that reveals whether the person has family members.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 552.117, Government Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 552.117. EXCEPTION: CERTAIN ADDRESSES, TELEPHONE
- 9 NUMBERS, [SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS,] AND PERSONAL FAMILY
- 10 INFORMATION. Information is excepted from the requirements of
- 11 Section 552.021 if it is information that relates to the home
- 12 address or [7] home telephone number[7 or social security number]
- 13 of the following person or that reveals whether the person has
- 14 family members:
- 15 (1) a current or former official or employee of a
- governmental body, except as otherwise provided by Section 552.024;
- 17 (2) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
- 18 Criminal Procedure, or a security officer commissioned under
- 19 Section 51.212, Education Code, regardless of whether the officer
- complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable;
- 21 (3) an employee of the Texas Department of Criminal
- Justice, regardless of whether the employee complies with Section
- 23 552.1175;
- 24 (4) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
- 25 Criminal Procedure, or other law, a reserve law enforcement
- 26 officer, a commissioned deputy game warden, or a corrections
- 27 officer in a municipal, county, or state penal institution in this

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- 1 state who was killed in the line of duty, regardless of whether the
- deceased complied with Section 552.024 or 552.1175; or
- 3 (5) a commissioned security officer as defined by
- 4 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, regardless of whether the
- officer complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable.
- 6 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 552.1175, Government
- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 552.1175. CONFIDENTIALITY OF ADDRESSES, TELEPHONE
- 9 NUMBERS, [SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS,] AND PERSONAL FAMILY
- 10 INFORMATION OF PEACE OFFICERS, COUNTY JAILERS, SECURITY OFFICERS,
- 11 AND EMPLOYEES OF TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE.
- 12 SECTION 5. Section 552.1175(b), Government Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- (b) Information that relates to the home address or  $[\tau]$  home
- 15 telephone number[ or social security number] of an individual to
- 16 whom this section applies, or that reveals whether the individual
- 17 has family members is confidential and may not be disclosed to the
- 18 public under this chapter if the individual to whom the information
- 19 relates:
- 20 (1) chooses to restrict public access to the
- 21 information; and
- 22 (2) notifies the governmental body of the individual's
- 23 choice on a form provided by the governmental body, accompanied by
- evidence of the individual's status.
- 25 SECTION 6. Section 552.132(b), Government Code, is amended
- 26 to read as follows:
- 27 (b) A crime victim may elect whether to allow public access

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- 1 to information held by the crime victim's compensation division of
- 2 the attorney general's office that relates to:
- 3 (1) the name, [social security number,] address, or
- 4 telephone number of the crime victim; or
- 5 (2) any other information the disclosure of which
- 6 would identify or tend to identify the crime victim.
- 7 SECTION 7. Section 552.136(b), Government Code, as added by
- 8 Chapter 143, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001,
- 9 is amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) Information maintained by a family violence shelter
- 11 center or sexual assault program is excepted from the requirements
- of Section 552.021 if it is information that relates to:
- 13 (1) the home address or  $[\tau]$  home telephone number  $[\tau]$
- 14 social security number] of an employee or a volunteer worker of a
- 15 family violence shelter center or a sexual assault program,
- 16 regardless of whether the employee or worker complies with Section
- 17 552.024;
- 18 (2) the location or physical layout of a family
- 19 violence shelter center;
- 20 (3) the name, home address, home telephone number, or
- 21 numeric identifier of a current or former client of a family
- violence shelter center or sexual assault program;
- 23 (4) the provision of services, including counseling
- 24 and sheltering, to a current or former client of a family violence
- 25 shelter center or sexual assault program;
- 26 (5) the name, home address, or home telephone number
- 27 of a private donor to a family violence shelter center or sexual

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- 1 assault program; or
- 2 (6) the home address or home telephone number of a
- 3 member of the board of directors or the board of trustees of a
- 4 family violence shelter center or sexual assault program,
- 5 regardless of whether the board member complies with Section
- 6 552.024.
- 7 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
