4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 21.0031 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 21.0031. FAILURE TO OBTAIN CERTIFICATION; CONTRACT
8	VOID. (a) An employee's probationary, continuing, or term
9	contract under this chapter is void if the employee:
10	(1) holds a certificate or permit issued by the State
11	Board for Educator Certification on a temporary or emergency basis;
12	and
13	(2) fails to obtain a certificate or permit required
14	by Section 21.003 appropriate for employment in the position
15	covered by the contract before the temporary or emergency
16	certificate or permit expires.
17	(b) On the date on which an employee's contract is void
18	under Subsection (a):
19	(1) a school district may:
20	(A) terminate the employee;
21	(B) suspend the employee with or without pay; or
22	(C) retain the employee on an at-will employment
23	basis at the employee's existing rate of pay or at a reduced rate;
24	<u>and</u>

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1	(2)	the	employee	is	not	entitled	to	the	minimum	salary

- 2 prescribed by Section 21.402.
- 3 (c) A school district's decision under Subsection (b) is not
- 4 <u>subject to appeal under this chapter.</u>
- 5 (d) This section does not affect the rights and remedies of a party in an at-will employment relationship.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and applies only to a contract entered into by a school district and an educator on or after that date.
