4	SECTION 1. Section 21.451, Education Code, is amended by
5	amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read
6	as follows:
7	(a) The staff development provided by a school district must
8	be <u>:</u>
9	(1) conducted in accordance with [minimum] standards
10	developed by the <u>district; and</u>
11	(2) designed to improve education in the district
12	[commissioner for program planning, preparation, and improvement.
13	The staff development:
14	[(1) must include training in:
15	[(A) technology;
16	[(B) conflict resolution; and
17	[(C) discipline strategies, including classroom
18	management, district discipline policies, and the student code of
19	conduct adopted under Section 37.001 and Chapter 37;
20	[(2) must include training that:
21	[(A) relates to instruction of students with
22	disabilities; and
23	[(B) is designed for educators who work primarily
24	outside of the area of special education; and

1 [(3) may include instruction as to what is permissible
2 under law, including opinions of the United States Supreme Court,
3 in regard to prayers in public school].

4 (b) The staff development must be predominantly 5 campus-based, related to achieving campus performance objectives 6 established under Section 11.253, and developed and approved by the campus-level committee established under Section 11.251. [Campus 7 staff development may include activities that enable the campus 8 staff to plan together to enhance existing skills, to share 9 effective strategies, to reflect on curricular and instructional 10 issues, to analyze student achievement results, to reflect on means 11 of increasing student achievement, to study research, to practice 12 new methods, to identify students' strengths and needs, to develop 13 meaningful programs for students, to appropriately implement 14 15 site-based decision-making, and to conduct action research. The campus staff development activities may be conducted using study 16 teams, individual research, peer coaching, workshops, seminars, 17 conferences, or other reasonable methods that have the potential to 18 improve student achievement.] 19 (d) The staff development may: 20 21 (1) include training in: 22 (A) t<u>echnology;</u> (B) conflict resolution; and 23 (C) discipline strategies, including classroom 24

25 management, district discipline policies, and the student code of

- 27 (2) include training that:

8	SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004
9	school year.
10	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
11	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
12	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
13	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
14	Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
