- 19 Sec. 32.157. PILOT PROJECT EVALUATION; EXPIRATION. (a)
- 20 After the expiration of the three-year pilot project, the agency
- 21 shall review the pilot project based on the annual reports the
- 22 agency receives from the board of trustees of participating school
- 23 <u>districts.</u> The agency shall include the review of the pilot project
- in the comprehensive annual report required under Section 39.182
- 25 that covers the 2006-2007 school year.
- 26 (b) This subchapter expires August 31, 2007.
- 27 SECTION 2. The Texas Education Agency shall adopt rules to

- 1 implement Subchapter D, Chapter 32, Education Code, as added by
- 2 this Act, not later than January 1, 2004. The agency shall make the
- 3 technology immersion pilot project available for participation
- 4 beginning with the 2004-2005 school year.
