- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Title 6, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Chapter 145 to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 145. CONFIDENTIALITY OF SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS
- 8 Sec. 145.001. APPLICABILITY. (a) This chapter does not
- 9 apply to a governmental body, as defined by Section 552.003,
- 10 Government Code.
- 11 (b) This chapter does not apply to documents that are:
- 12 (1) required or permitted by state or federal law to be
- 13 recorded in public records; or
- 14 (2) required to be collected, used, or disclosed to
- 15 the public by state or federal law.
- Sec. 145.002. PROHIBITED USES. (a) In this section,
- 17 "publicly display" means to intentionally communicate or otherwise
- 18 make available to the general public.
- (b) A person may not:
- (1) publicly display in any manner an individual's
- 21 social security number;
- 22 (2) require an individual to transmit a social
- 23 security number over the Internet, unless the connection is secure
- or the social security number is encrypted;

- 1 (3) require an individual to use a social security
- 2 number to access an Internet website, unless a password or unique
- 3 personal identification number or other authentication device is
- 4 <u>also required to access the website;</u>
- 5 (4) print an individual's social security number on
- 6 any card required for the individual to have access to products or
- 7 <u>services provided by the person; or</u>
- 8 (5) print an individual's social security number on
- 9 any materials that are mailed to the individual, unless state or
- 10 <u>federal law requires the social security number to be printed on the</u>
- 11 document to be mailed.
- (c) Subsection (b)(5) does not apply to applications or
- forms sent by mail, including a document sent:

- 19 Sec. 145.003. PERMITTED USES. (a) A person may collect,
- 20 use, or release a social security number for internal verification
- 21 or administrative purposes.
- (b) A person who, before January 1, 2005, has used an
- 23 <u>individual's social security number in a manner prohibited by</u>
- 24 Section 145.002 may continue using that individual's social
- 25 security number in the same manner if:

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- 1 (2) the person provides the individual with an annual

- 5 (c) This chapter does not apply to a person who collects,

- 9 Sec. 145.004. DISCONTINUANCE OF USE ON REQUEST. (a) If a
- 10 person receives a written request from an individual directing the
- 11 person to stop using the individual's social security number in a
- manner prohibited by Section 145.002, the person shall comply with
- 13 the request not later than the 30th day after the date the request
- 14 is received.
- (b) The person may not impose a fee or charge for complying
- 16 with the request.
- 17 Sec. 145.005. DENIAL OF SERVICES PROHIBITED. A person may
- 18 not deny products or services to an individual because the
- 19 individual makes a written request to discontinue use under Section
- 20 145.004.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect January 1, 2005.
