Each commissioned deputy is entitled to the longevity pay in addition to the deputy's regular 1-23 1-24 compensation. (a-1) In a county with a population of 150,000 or more, the commissioners court may provide to each county jailer of the sheriff's department longevity pay in the amount provided to a 1-25 1-26 1-27 commissioned deputy under Subsection (a).

(c) In this section, "county jailer" has the meaning assigned by Section 1701.001, Occupations Code.
