1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to longevity pay for county jailers employed by certain  
1-9 sheriff's departments.

1-10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-11 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 152.074, Local Government  
1-12 Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-13 Sec. 152.074. LONGEVITY PAY FOR COMMISSIONED DEPUTIES AND  
1-14 COUNTY JAILERS.

1-15 SECTION 2. Section 152.074, Local Government Code, is  
1-16 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and  
1-17 (c) to read as follows:

1-18 (a) In a county with a population of 150,000 or more, the  
1-19 commissioners court shall provide to ~~[longevity pay for]~~ each  
1-20 commissioned deputy of the sheriff's department longevity pay in an  
1-21 amount [of] not less than \$5 a month for each year of service in the  
1-22 department, up to and including 25 years. Each commissioned deputy  
1-23 is entitled to the longevity pay in addition to the deputy's regular  
1-24 compensation.

1-25 (a-1) In a county with a population of 150,000 or more, the  
1-26 commissioners court may provide to each county jailer of the  
1-27 sheriff's department longevity pay in the amount provided to a  
1-28 commissioned deputy under Subsection (a).

1-29 (c) In this section, "county jailer" has the meaning  
1-30 assigned by Section 1701.001, Occupations Code.

1-31 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
