20 SECTION 2. Section 321.3022(f), Tax Code, is amended to 21 read as follows:

(f) Information received by a municipality under this section is confidential, is not open to public inspection, and may be used only for the purpose of economic forecasting, for internal

<u>auditing of a tax paid to the municipality under this chapter</u>, or
for the purpose described in Subsection (g).
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
