On receipt of an application from a foreign applicant for the 7 expedited processing of a license under Section 155.1025(a)(2), 8 9 Occupations Code, the department, in accordance with 8 U.S.C. Section 1182(e), as amended, under exceptions provided by 8 U.S.C. 10 Section 1184(1), as amended, may request waiver of the foreign 11 12 country residence requirement for a qualified alien physician who agrees to practice medicine in a medically underserved area or 13 14 health professional shortage area, as designated by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, that has a current 15 16 shortage of physicians. SECTION 2. Section 155.1025(a), Occupations Code, 17 is amended to read as follows: 18 (a) The board shall adopt rules for expediting 19 any application for a license under this subtitle made by a person who 20 21 is licensed to practice medicine in another state or country and who 22 submits an affidavit with the application stating that: 23 (1) the applicant intends to practice in a rural 24 community, as determined by the Office of Rural Community Affairs
