A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to participation by private school students in University
- 3 Interscholastic League sponsored activities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 33.087 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 33.087. PARTICIPATION BY PRIVATE SCHOOL STUDENTS IN
- 8 <u>UNIVERSITY INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE ACTIVITIES</u>. (a) The University
- 9 Interscholastic League may not deny a school or its students the
- 10 opportunity to participate in an activity sponsored by the league
- 11 or the opportunity to become a member of an appropriate league
- 12 <u>district because the school is a private school.</u>
- (b) This section does not exempt a private school or its
- 14 students from satisfying each eligibility requirement imposed by
- 15 this subchapter or the University Interscholastic League for
- 16 participating in an activity or league district sponsored by the
- 17 league.
- (c) A private school seeking to participate in a University
- 19 Interscholastic League activity or to become a member of a league
- 20 <u>district must apply to the league on a signed form prescribed by the</u>
- 21 league. The private school must certify its eligibility under this
- 22 subchapter and league rules in the application and must attach
- 23 proof of accreditation. The league may not impose requirements for
- 24 private schools that exceed the requirements of this subchapter or

- 1 league rules for public schools. On approval of an application, the
- 2 league shall issue a certificate of approval to the applicant
- 3 school. The application and certificate of approval are
- 4 governmental records for purposes of Section 37.10, Penal Code.
- 5 (d) To determine the appropriate University Interscholastic
- 6 League district in which an eligible private school with a single
- 7 sex student enrollment will participate, the league must multiply
- 8 the private school's enrollment by two and place the private school
- 9 <u>in an appropriate league district based on that enrollment figure.</u>
- 10 (e) For purposes of determining the eligibility of a student
- 11 to participate in a University Interscholastic League activity, the
- 12 attendance zone for an eligible private school is the geographic
- 13 area of the public school district in which the private school is
- 14 located.
- 15 <u>(f) To be eligible under this section, a private school</u>
- 16 <u>must:</u>
- 17 (1) be accredited by an accrediting organization
- 18 recognized by the Texas Education Agency;
- 19 (2) offer a four-year high school curriculum;
- 20 (3) offer interscholastic competition; and
- 21 (4) require daily student attendance at a specific
- 22 location.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004
- 24 school year.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
