- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 149.002 and 149.003, Agriculture Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 149.002. SALE OR POSSESSION OF HORSEMEAT. A person
- 8 commits an offense if:
- 9 (1) the person sells, offers for sale, or exhibits for
- 10 sale horsemeat as food for human consumption in the United States;
- 11 or
- 12 (2) the person possesses horsemeat with the intent to
- 13 sell the horsemeat as food for human consumption in the United
- 14 States.
- 15 Sec. 149.003. TRANSFER OF HORSEMEAT. A person commits an
- 16 offense if the person:
- 17 (1) transfers horsemeat to a person who intends to
- 18 sell the horsemeat, offer or exhibit it for sale, or possess it for
- 19 sale as food for human consumption in the United States; and
- 20 (2) knows or in the exercise of reasonable discretion
- 21 should know that the person receiving the horsemeat intends to sell
- the horsemeat, offer or exhibit it for sale, or possess it for sale
- as food for human consumption in the United States.
- 24 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 146, Agriculture Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Section 146.009 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 146.009. SALE OF EQUINE ANIMAL; NOTICE REQUIRED. (a)
- 3 <u>In this section:</u>
- 4 (1) "Equine animal" has the meaning assigned by
- 5 <u>Section 161.149</u>.
- 6 (2) "Livestock market" has the meaning assigned by
- 7 Section 161.111.
- 8 <u>(b) The owner or operator of a livestock market shall</u>
- 9 require that any person who sells an equine animal directly or on
- 10 consignment at the market sign an acknowledgment form stating that
- 11 an equine animal sold at the market may be bought for slaughter.
- 12 The owner or operator may incorporate the acknowledgement form into
- 13 any other forms a person is required to sign before selling an
- 14 equine animal at the market.
- (c) An owner or operator of a livestock market commits an
- offense if the owner or operator violates this section.
- 17 (d) An offense under Subsection (c) is a Class C
- 18 misdemeanor.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 149.004, Agriculture Code, is repealed.
- 20 SECTION 4. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 21 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 22 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before
- 23 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 24 before the effective date.
- 25 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 26 Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 27 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
