- 2 relating to the liability insurance and security requirements for
- 3 wood treaters engaged in the business of structural pest control.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 1951.312, Occupations
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1951.312. LIABILITY INSURANCE; EXCEPTIONS.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 1951.312, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (e) to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 (a) The board may not issue or renew a structural pest
- 12 control business license until the license applicant:
- 13 (1) files with the board a policy or contract of
- 14 insurance, approved as sufficient by the board, in an amount not
- less than \$200,000 for bodily injury and property damage coverage,
- 16 with a minimum total aggregate of \$300,000 for all occurrences,
- insuring the applicant against liability for damage to persons or
- 18 property occurring as a result of operations performed in the
- 19 course of the business of structural pest control on premises or any
- 20 other property under the applicant's care, custody, or control;
- 21 [or]
- 22 (2) in the case of an applicant who has an unexpired
- 23 and uncanceled insurance policy or contract on file with the board,
- 24 files with the board a certificate or other evidence from an

- 1 insurance company stating that:
- 2 (A) the policy or contract insures the applicant
- 3 against liability for acts and damage as described in Subdivision
- 4 (1); and
- 5 (B) the amount of insurance coverage is in the
- 6 amount approved by the board;
- 7 (3) files with the board a bond, certificate of
- 8 deposit, or other proof acceptable to the board of sufficient funds
- 9 in an amount not less than \$300,000 for payment of claims of damage
- 10 to persons or property occurring as a result of operations
- 11 performed negligently in the course of the business of structural
- 12 pest control on premises or any other property under the
- applicant's care, custody, or control; or
- 14 (4) files with the board evidence satisfactory to the
- 15 board of coverage under a general liability insurance policy, if
- the applicant operates solely as a wood treater.
- 17 (b) A structural pest control business license holder shall
- 18 at all times maintain the insurance policy or contract or the
- 19 security described by Subsection (a)(3) in the amount approved by
- 20 the board. Failure to renew the policy or contract or maintain it
- 21 <u>or the security</u> in the required amount is a ground for suspension or
- 22 revocation of the license and a violation of this section.
- (e) An applicant who files proof under Subsection (a)(3)
- 24 must designate a third party not affiliated with the applicant to
- 25 handle the processing of damage claims regarding that security.
- SECTION 3. Section 1951.312, Occupations Code, as amended
- 27 by this Act, applies only to a license issued or renewed on or after

- 2 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
