5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Article 56.06(a), Code of Criminal Procedure, is

amended to read as follows:

- 8 (a) If a [A] law enforcement agency [that] requests a
- 9 medical examination of a victim of an alleged sexual assault for use
- 10 in the investigation or prosecution of the offense, the person
- 11 performing the examination [shall pay all costs of the examination.
- 12 On application to the attorney general, the law enforcement agency]
- is entitled to be reimbursed for the reasonable costs of that
- 14 examination on application to the attorney general if the person is
- 15 [examination was performed by] a physician or [by] a sexual assault
- 16 examiner or sexual assault nurse examiner, as defined by Section
- 17 420.003, Government Code. The person is entitled to reimbursement
- 18 under this subsection without regard to whether the person is
- 19 <u>affiliated with a hospital.</u>
- 20 SECTION 2. Article 56.54(k), Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- (k) The attorney general may use the compensation to victims
- of crime fund to provide reasonable compensation to [reimburse] a
- 24 provider [law enforcement agency] for performing [the reasonable

- 1 costs of] a medical examination [that are incurred by the agency]
- 2 under Article 56.06.
- 3 SECTION 3. Article 56.06(c), Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 4 repealed.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and
- 6 applies only to the compensation of a physician, sexual assault
- 7 examiner, or sexual assault nurse examiner for an examination
- 8 requested on or after September 1, 2003, under Article 56.06, Code
- 9 of Criminal Procedure, as amended by this Act. An examination
- 10 requested before September 1, 2003, is covered by the law in effect
- 11 when the request is made, and the former law is continued in effect
- 12 for that purpose.
